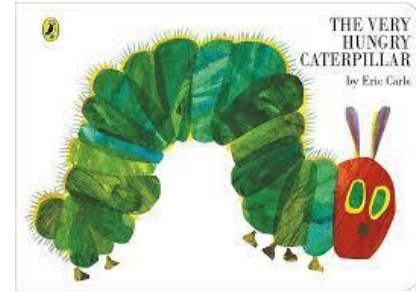
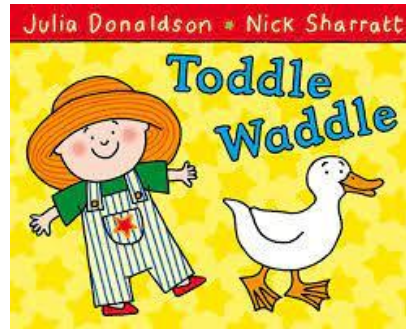
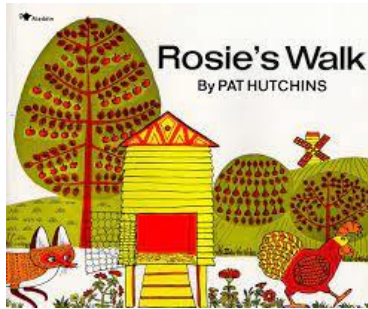

Dip and Do Home Learning

Please **sing some nursery rhymes** at home. Evidence suggests that “If children know 8 nursery rhymes by heart by the time they are 4 years old, they are usually among the best readers and spellers in their class by the time they are 8”. (Megan Fox, Reading Magic)

Next week we will be learning all about our families. **Please spend some time talking to your child about different members of your family.** This should enable them to talk confidently in school. Who is in your family? What do they look like? What do they like doing? Do they live with you? How are they related to you? Do you have any pets?

3-a-day Stories: These are stories that the children hear every day. These stories have been carefully chosen to help the children to develop a love of reading and to help them to develop early reading skills. These stories have key elements that support the children to retell them for example many of them use rhyme or repeated phrases. Please read these at home too, if you do not have them you could borrow them from a library or watch them on YouTube.
