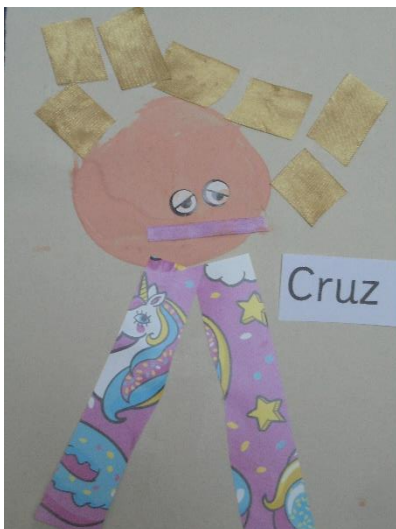
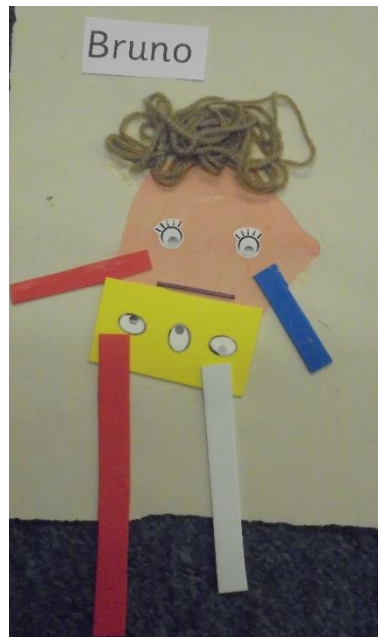
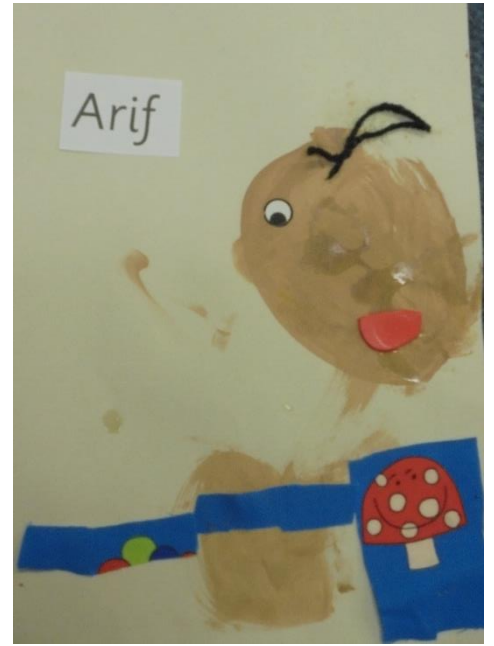
It was also lovely to see so many of you at parents evening meetings this week and we are so pleased that you are all eager to support your children in their learning.

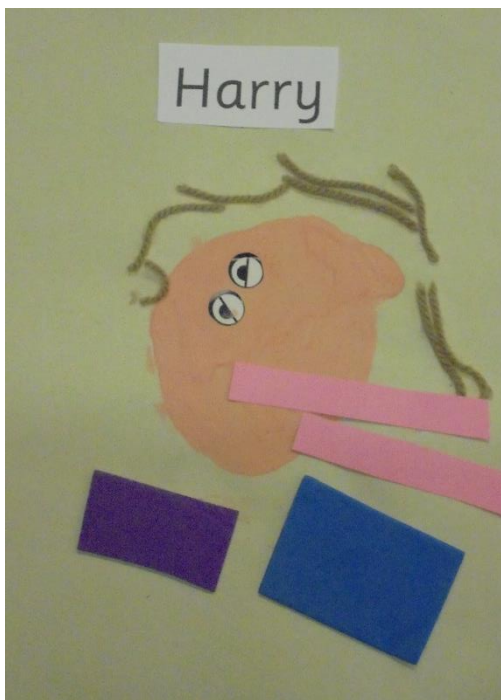
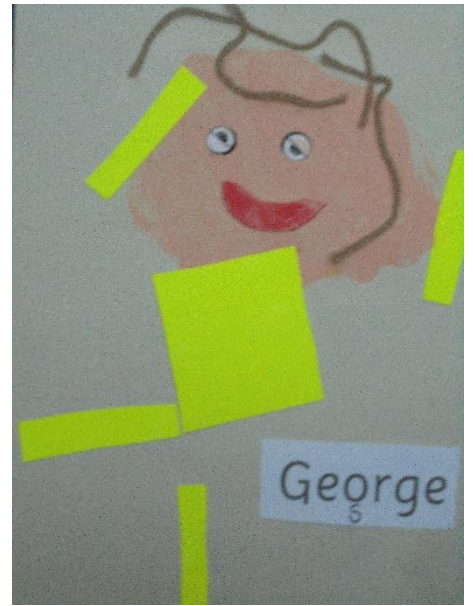

Applying your child's primary school place

All of our current nursery children are due to start primary school in September 2025.

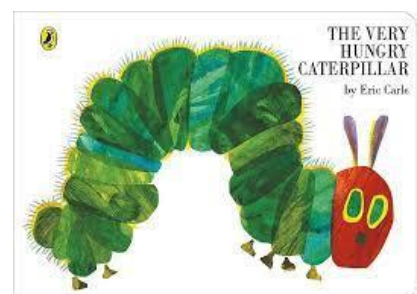
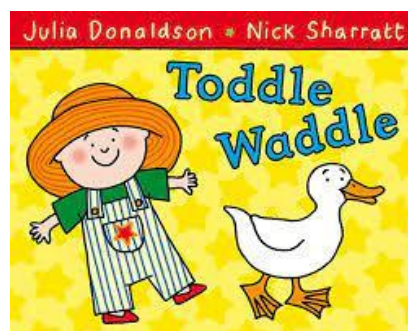
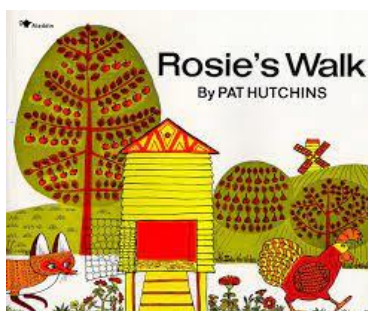
Applications open on 1st September 2024 and close on 15th January 2025.
