- Read daily at home for at least 20 minutes and record this in your diary. Diaries are checked on a Monday but you must have your reading folder in everyday.

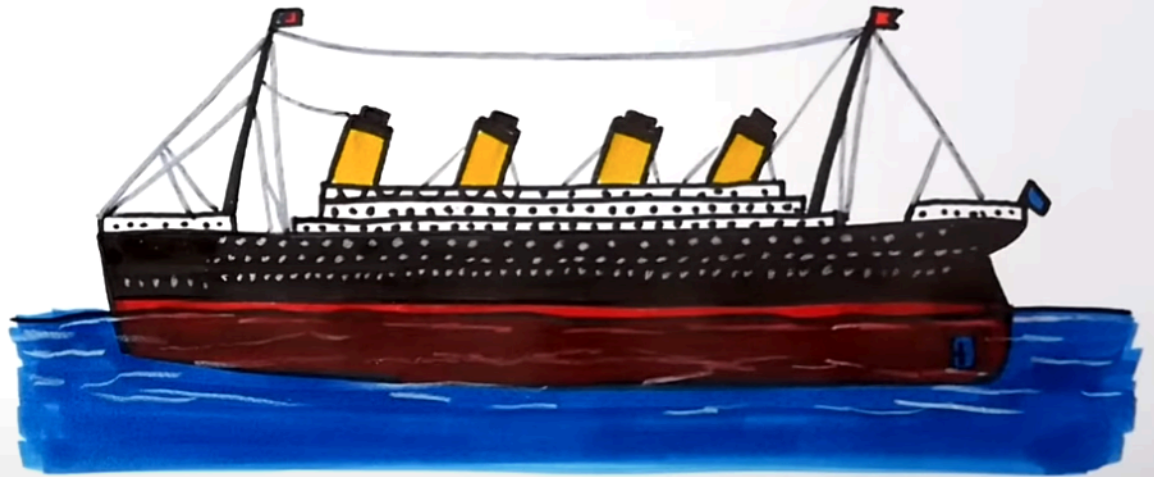
- Learn the weekly spelling words which are sent home and assigned on Spelling Shed. You will be tested every Monday morning (this will start next week).

### The Story of The Titanic


The Titanic was a luxury ocean liner built in Belfast, Northern Ireland in 1912. A company called White Star Line asked the shipbuilders Harland and Wolff to construct the ship. It took three years to complete and was ready to take passengers on the ocean by the 31<sup>st</sup> March 1912.
