Enquiry Question of the week

How will a beam of light shining on a glass prism behave and who discovered this?

A: A prism separates visible light into its different colours. As light passes through the prism, it slows and bends, but different wavelengths bend at different angles. This separates light into different wavelengths, forming a rainbow of colours. This was discovered by Isaac Newton
