Important Notice

We will be welcoming some more new children to Nursery after the Easter holidays and we will also have some additional staff joining us for the afternoon sessions. We will confirm who is working when as soon as the details are confirmed.

Due to having more children we will be making some changes to the drop off and collection routines to try and make this is a faster and smoother transition for everyone.

If your child is in Amber group we would now encourage you to enter the school via the large wooden, Reception gates (just past the usual Nursery gate) and your child will enter via Copper Class (the third door along from the gate). This is where Amber Group meet for their Key Worker time so they are very familiar with the room and we will move their boxes to be nearer to this area. They should be collected from the same door at the end of the day.

If your child is in Ollie Group and they attend Full Time Nursery, they should enter via the usual Nursery door in the morning but could you please collect them from Copper Class at the end of the day. We would

encourage you to enter the school via the large wooden, Reception gates (just past the usual Nursery gate) and your child will enter via Copper Class (the third door along from the gate). We will ensure that they have already collected all of their belongings.

If your child attends morning or afternoon nursery could you please continue to use the main Nursery door.

If your child is in Millie group please continue to use the main Nursery door.
