Next term, we will be learning about London! We will be looking at some of the landmarks that can be found there.

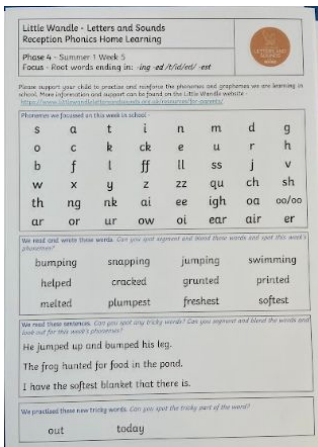

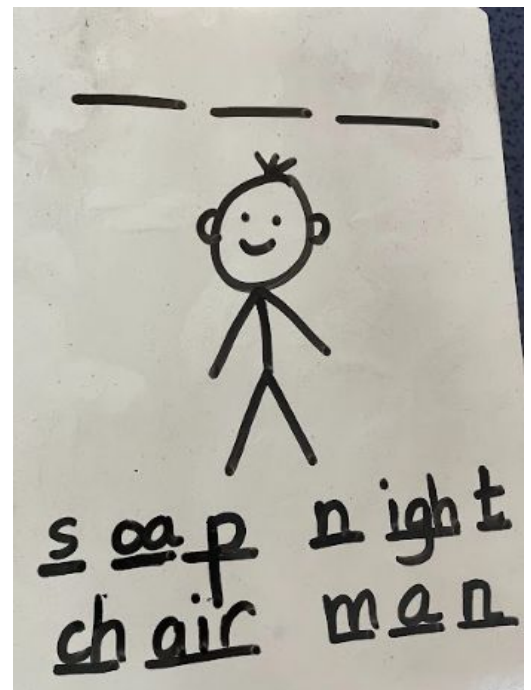
New set of Tricky Words

We would like to share with you a game we play with the children. It is based on the traditional Hangman game but we build a Happy Man instead. We have included examples of words we might use to show you that we count digraphs and trigraphs as one line, because they make one sound. Have fun

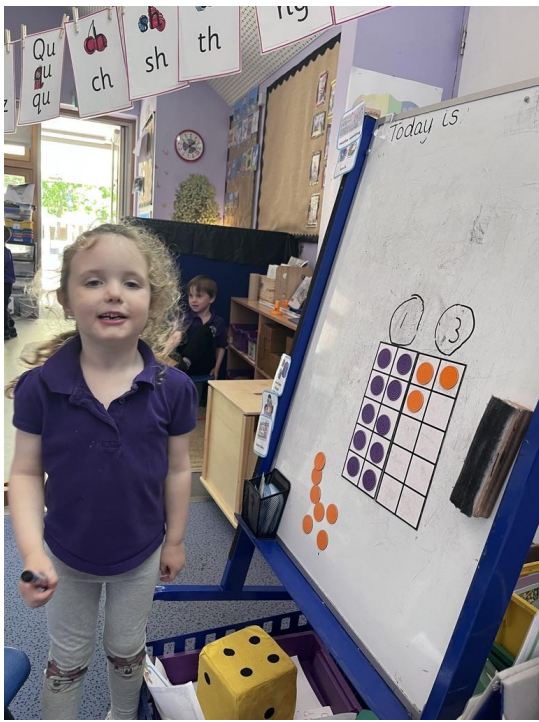

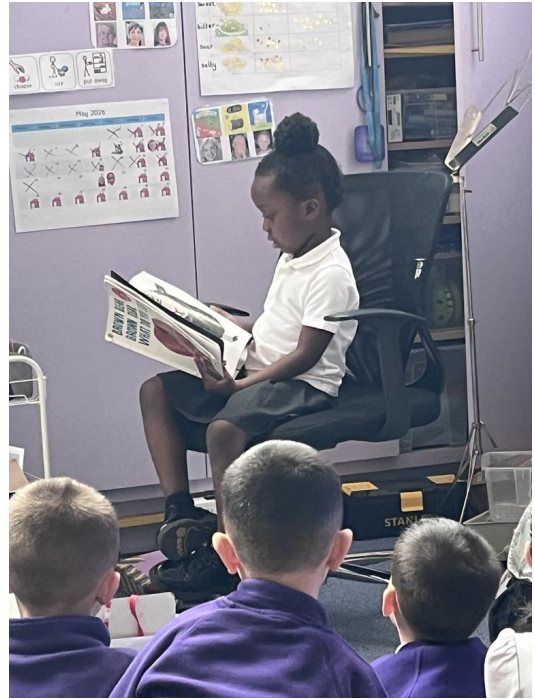
What happened to the gingerbread men when they were put in water?

How did you make 13?

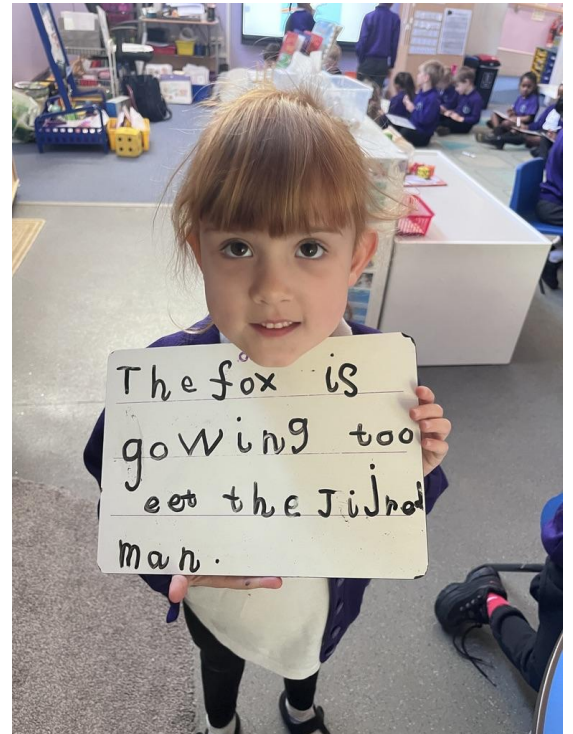
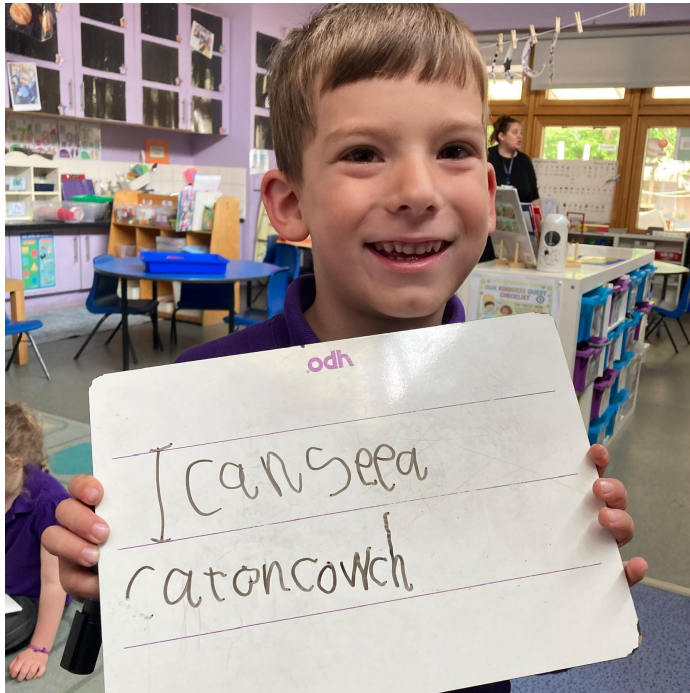


Our children have been reading to the class this week. How far they have come!
