Mapping London and lots more!

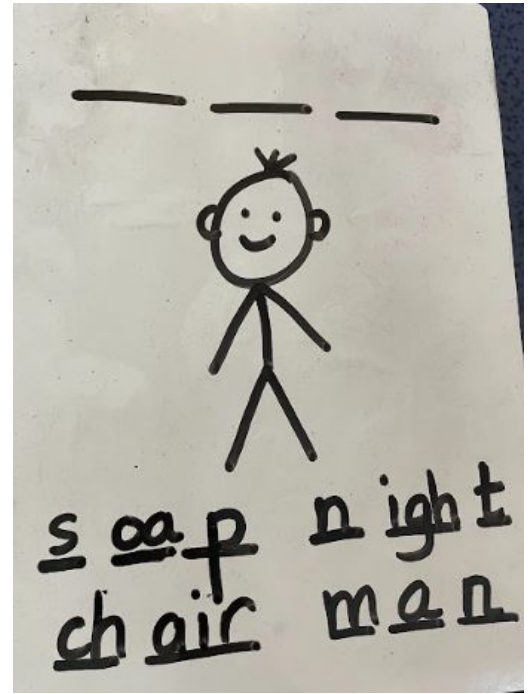
Following on from last week's bus journey through London, we have been making and labelling our own maps of London. It was lovely to see how many of the children remembered the landmarks that they had learnt about last week, such as Big Ben, inside the Queen Elizabeth Tower, Buckingham Palace, the London Eye and the Tower of London.

The tadpoles have grown and some are now froglets and have been released back into the Forest School pond. We have been learning about the life cycle of a frog and putting pictures in order to show the sequence. The caterpillars in Silver Class are growing and they look like they may become chrysalises soon. Bronze Class are getting new caterpillars next week as the first batch were not alive. It was a useful lesson for the children to see how small they were when they first hatched and that also, sometimes, they do not survive.

We have also started learning about what plants need to grow. We planted beans in cups, using wet tissue to hold them in place. We will watch as the roots grow and then the shoots. Maybe we can take them home so we can harvest them when they are fully grown.

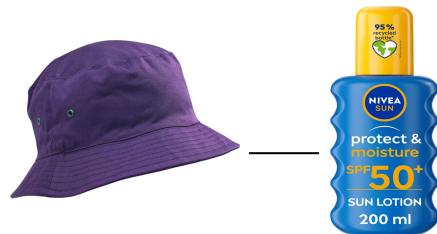
Happy Man

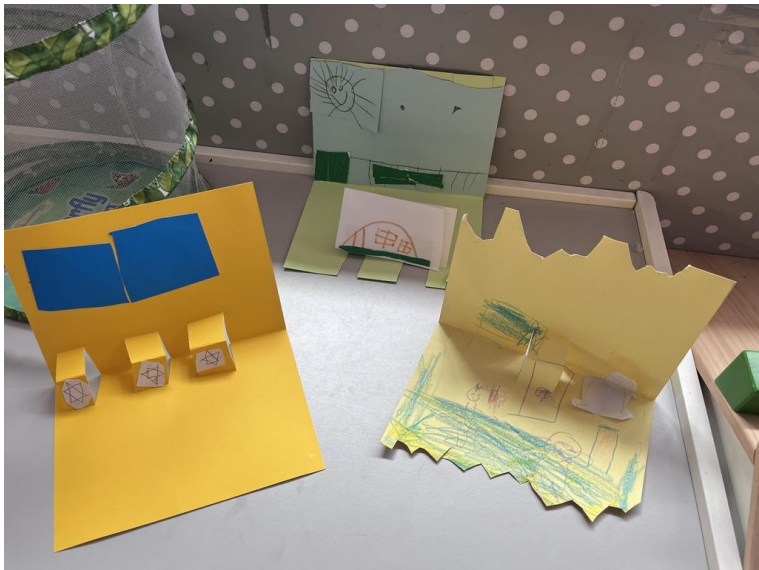

Using addition and subtraction to play Bus Stop. How many moves are you going to make and how many people are getting on and off the bus?




Our Year 5 Big Friends showed us some wonderful pop-up books that they had made. This inspired us to make some of our own. Maybe you could try making one at home?



Do you remember the process for planting our beans? What did we do first? Then we....



We have started writing Bean Diaries to help us remember what we have been learning.





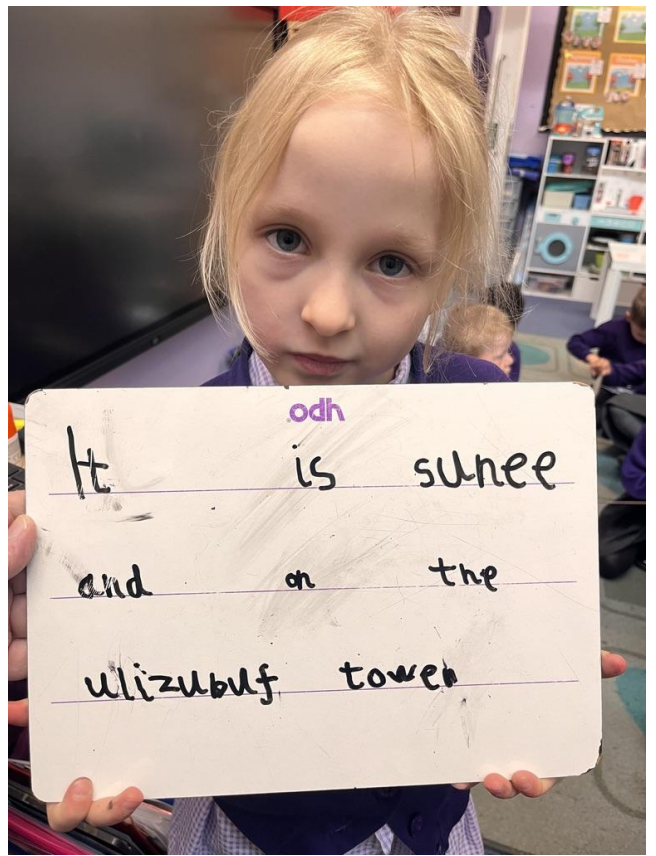
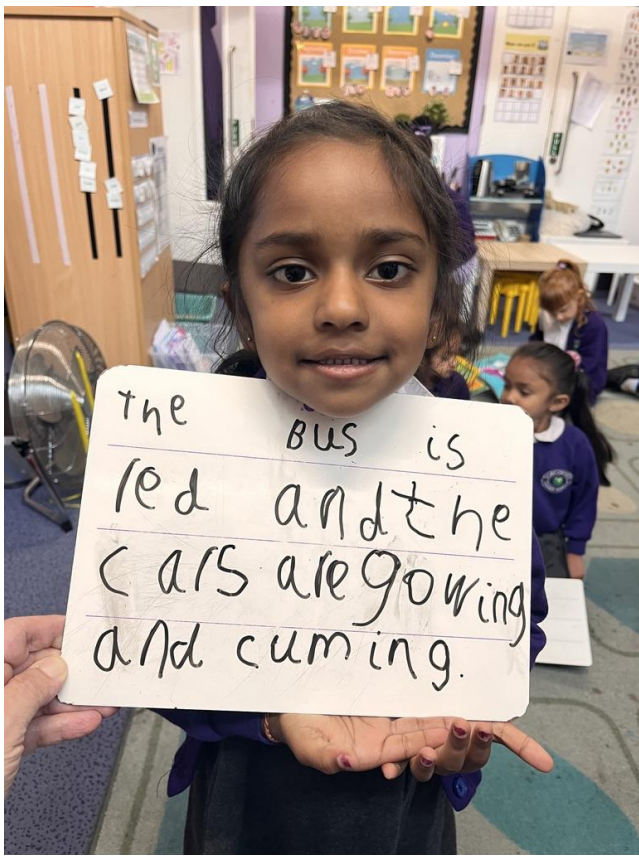
Yay! Bronze class had a mystery reader this week. We were very lucky. Do you remember what story we heard.

Working together to balance the cars. I wonder how many they managed to get on the guttering?

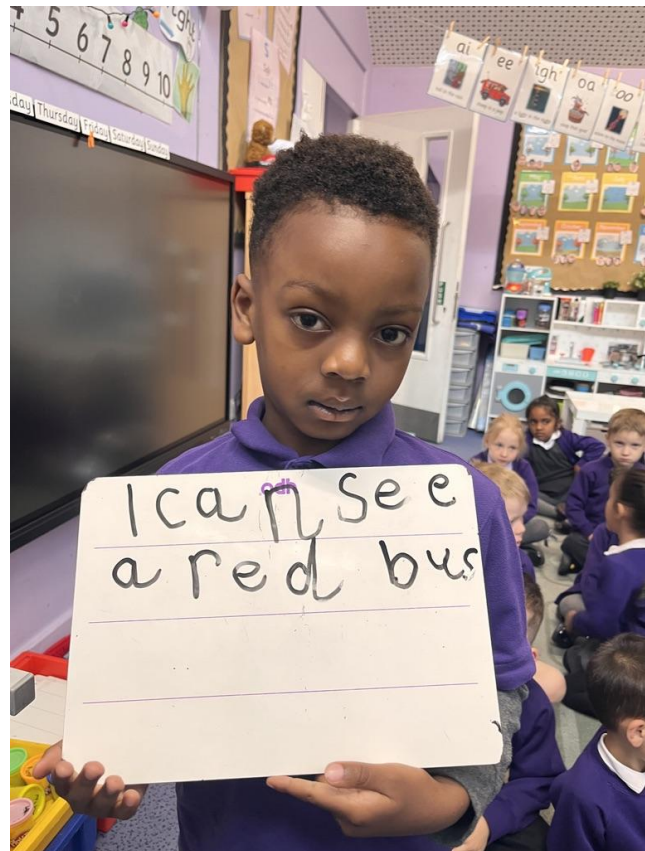
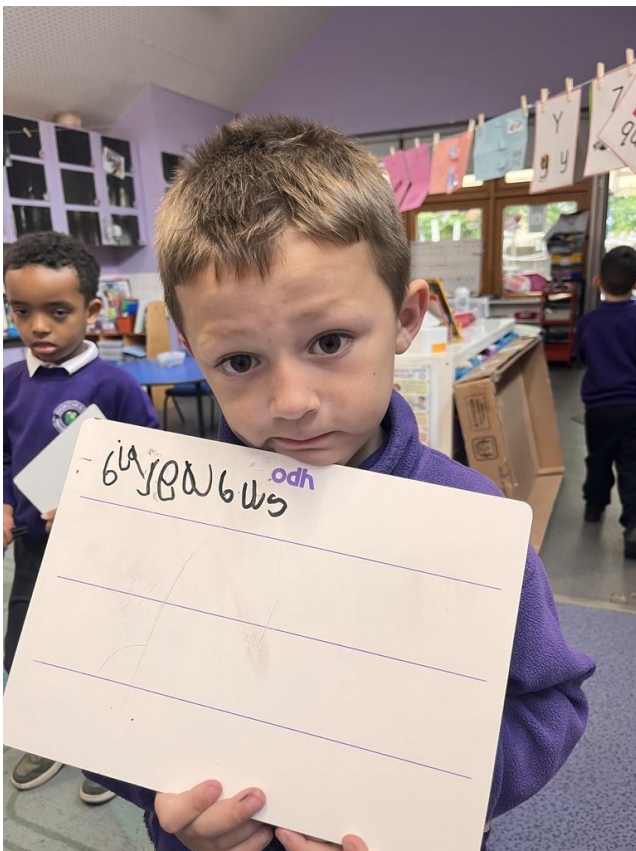


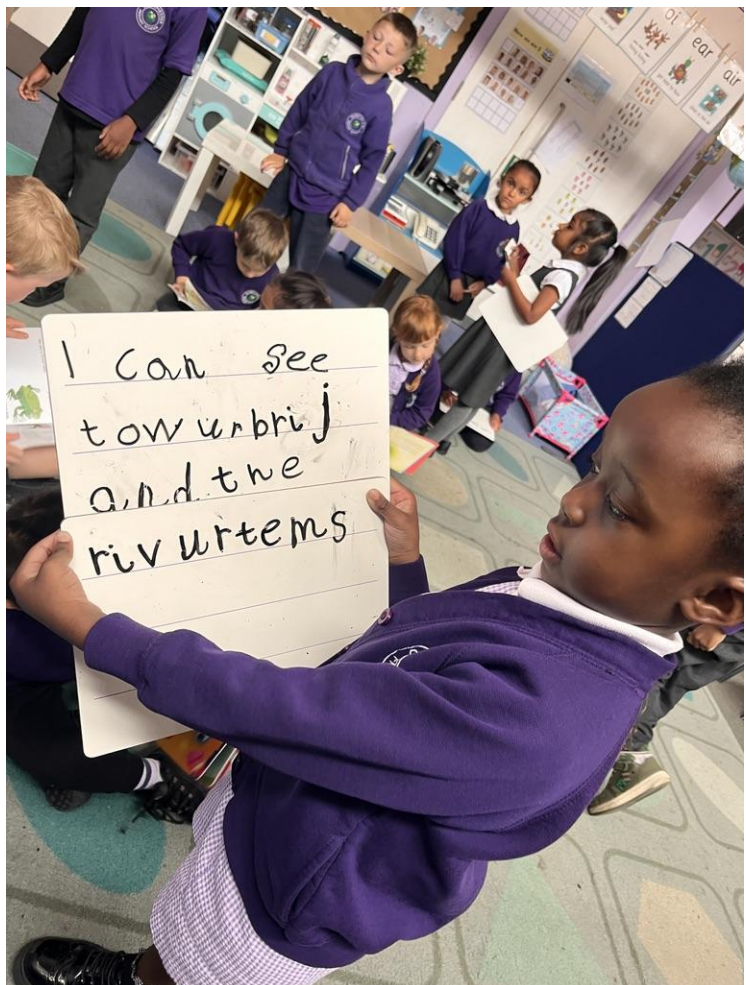
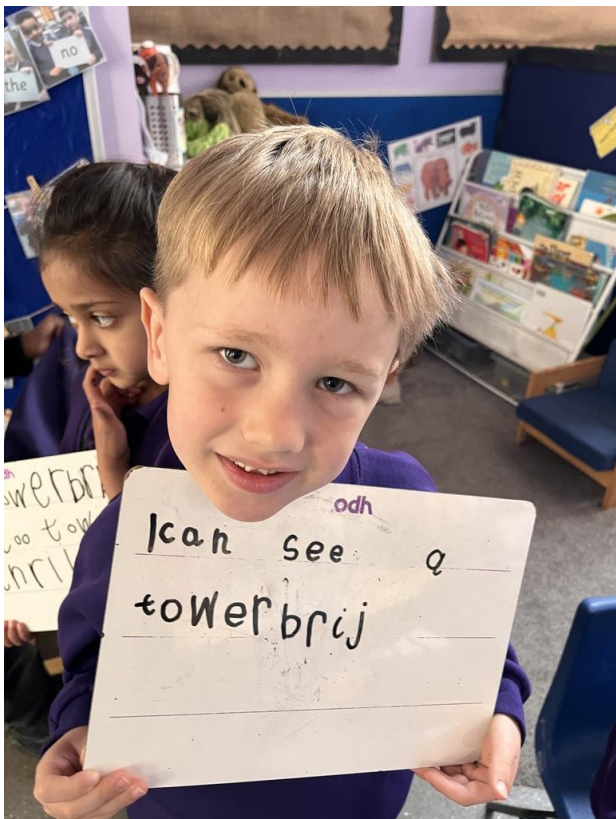
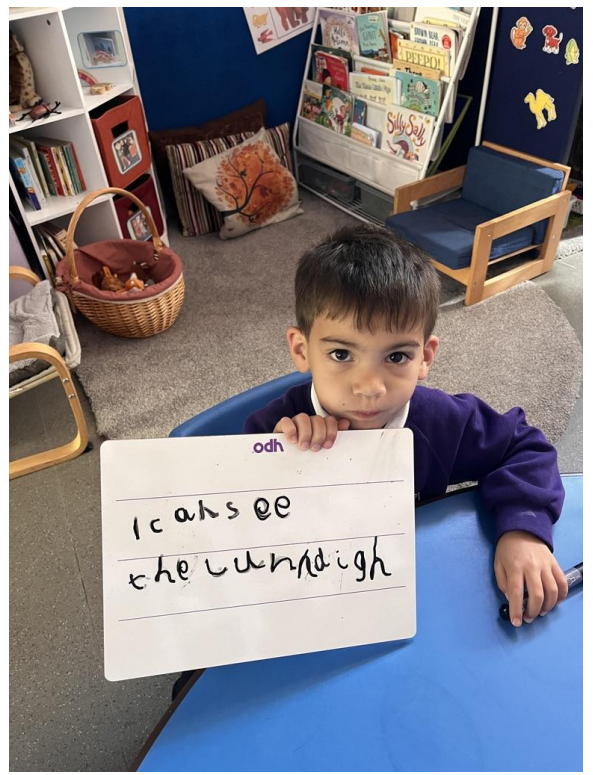
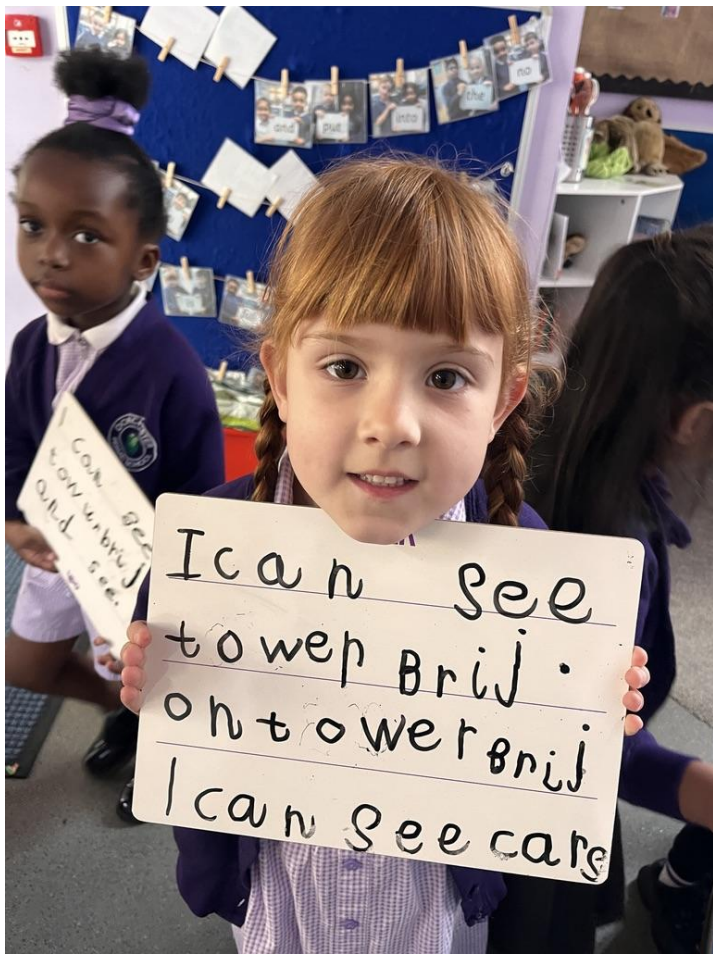
As the children come to the end of their Reception year, their ability to create with a variety of materials, has become more sophisticated.





We are so proud of our writing! We use the sounds we have learnt to write about things we can see!

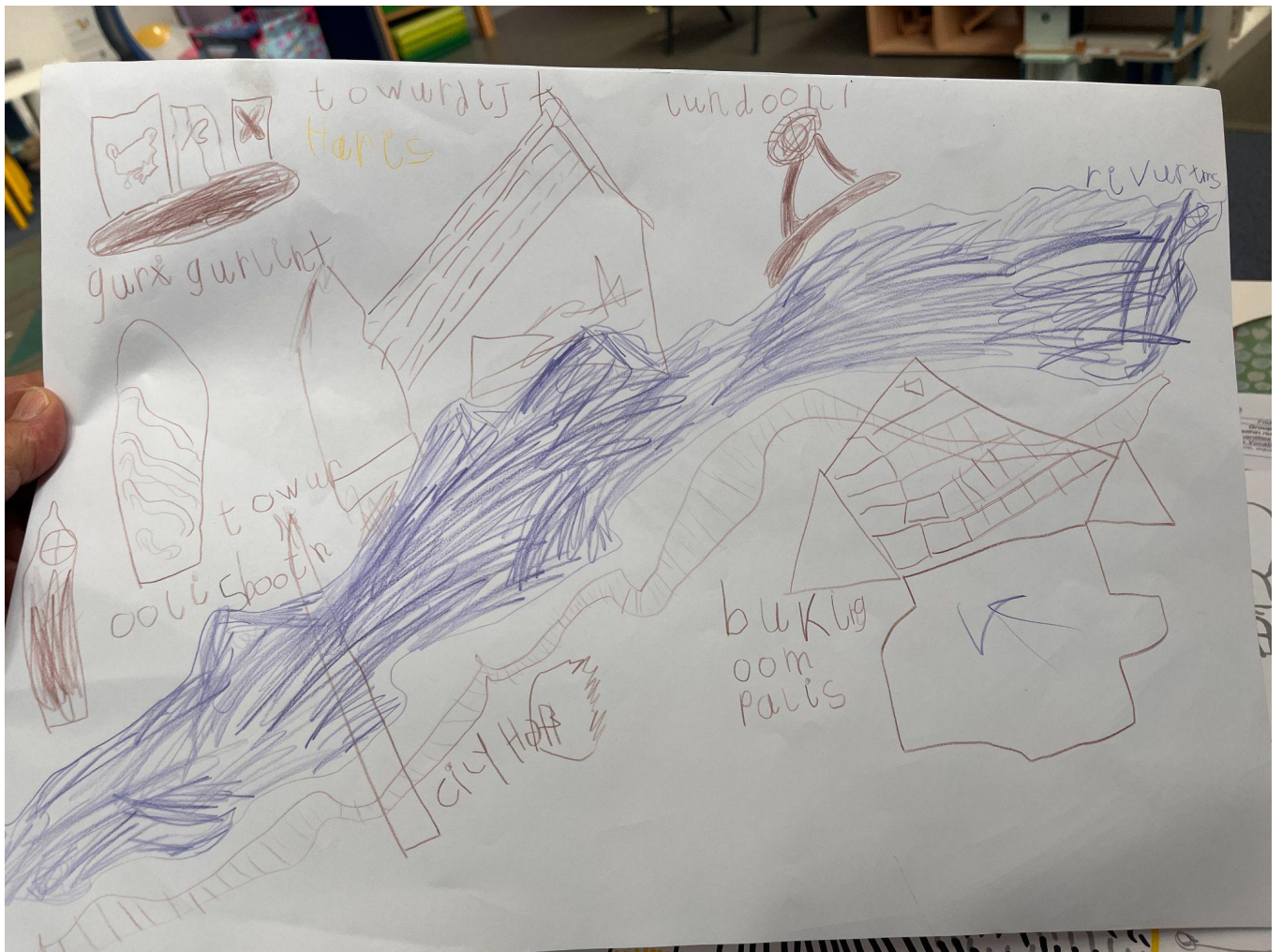


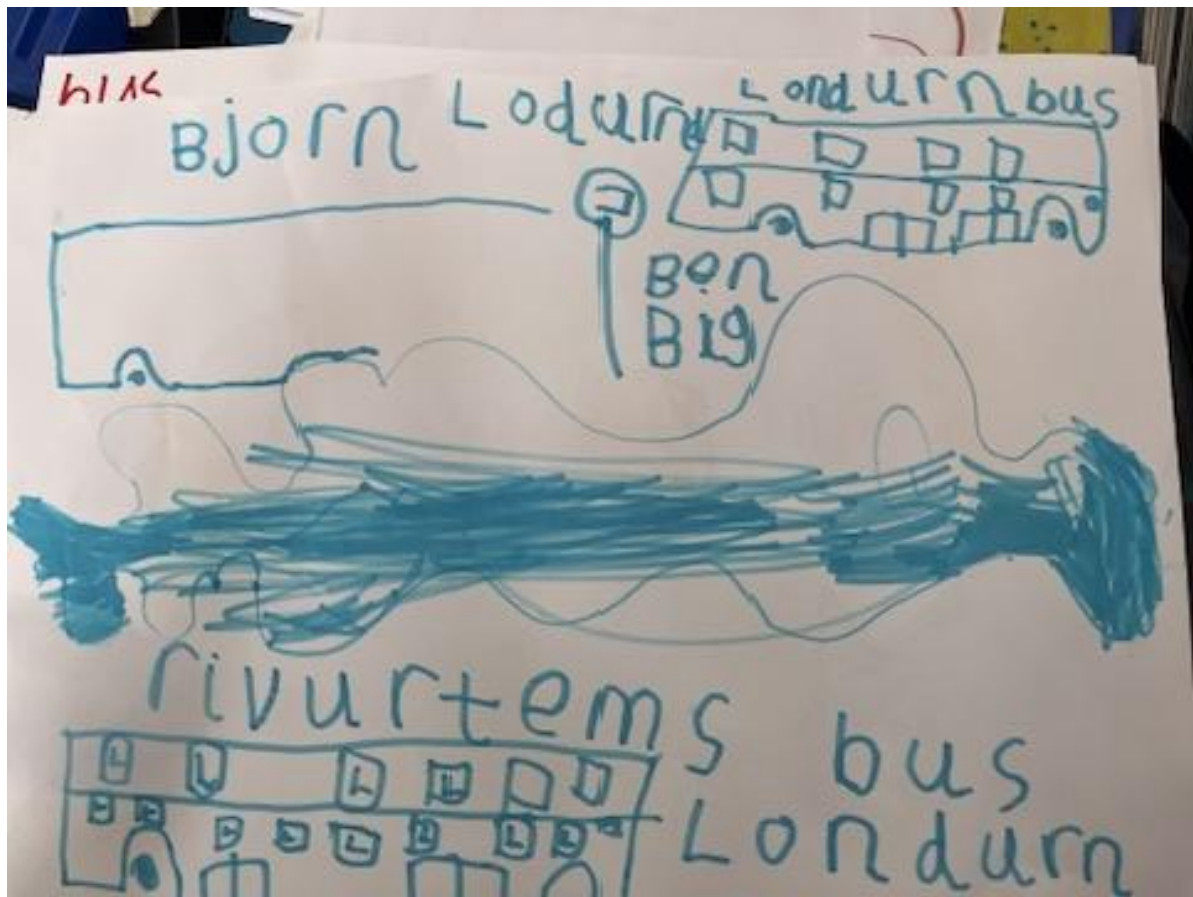




We have been making Maps of London and labelling them with the major landmarks.
