Things to know:

- Well done to all of the children for the effort put into completing assessment booklets in SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar), Reading and Maths during the past 2 weeks.
- Your child will find out their new class and teacher at the end of the month. We know this is a time of anxiety for some children. Please rest assured that we will be planning some transition activities to help prepare your child for Year 6.
- Forest School next week will be Blue Class - please make sure your child is prepared for sun (Sunscreen) or rain (a coat)!
- Swimming continues this half term for Sapphire Class on Friday.
- Tuesday will be Father's day shop. If you would like your child to visit the shop please pay the £2 online. See FODs email for more detail.
- **Monday 22nd June** will be our **Victorian day**. This was mentioned in the Peek a few weeks back. This is where we ask the children to dress either as a rich Victorian child or a poor Victorian child. We will have a school day based on how the Victorians taught. The classroom will be set out differently to replicate a Victorian classroom. We will be playing the part of Victorian teachers and assistants. Please prepare your child for a different, but fun day, especially if change is something they find difficult. We want everyone to be able to get the most out of this day - a day that children remember for a long time. **When they arrive for school on Monday 22nd please could they wait at the front of the school, as this is where we will meet them to line up, set the scene and explain how the day will work before we take them into class.**
- We have 4 weeks until the end of term and lots to do and achieve before the children move on to Year 6. The children will find out about their new teacher and class mix at the beginning of July so we will have plenty of time for transition opportunities. We will be making social stories for the children who need some extra support with the transition.
