

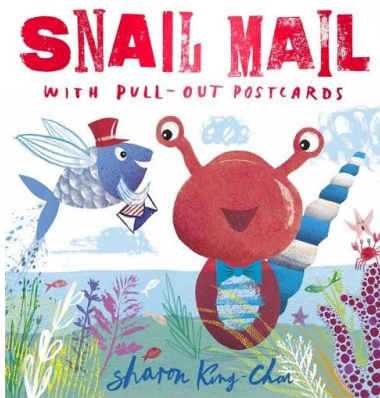
# Peek at the Week

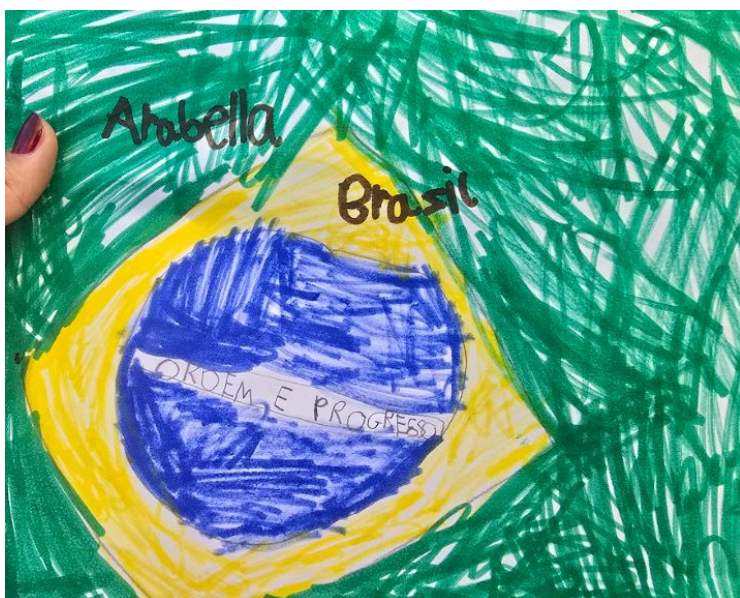
## Silver Class Assembly

**Please practise the lines and song at home, as this will help the children feel even more confident. We are very excited to perform in front of everyone soon and can't wait to share our hard work with you!**

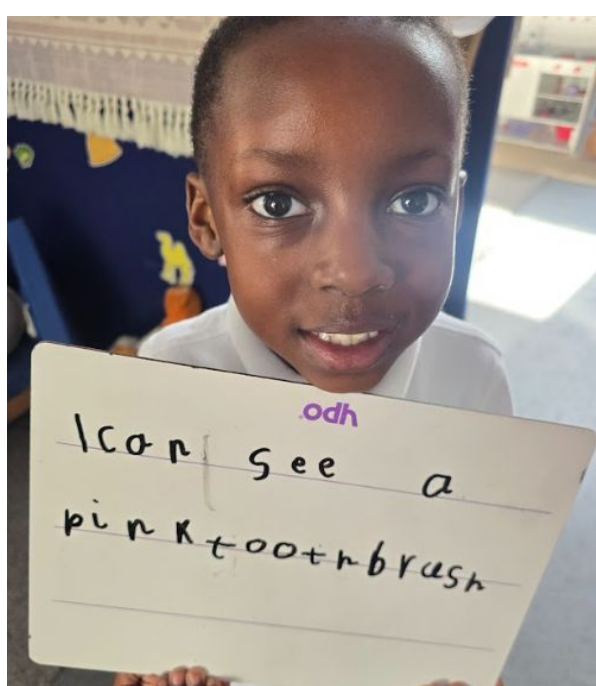
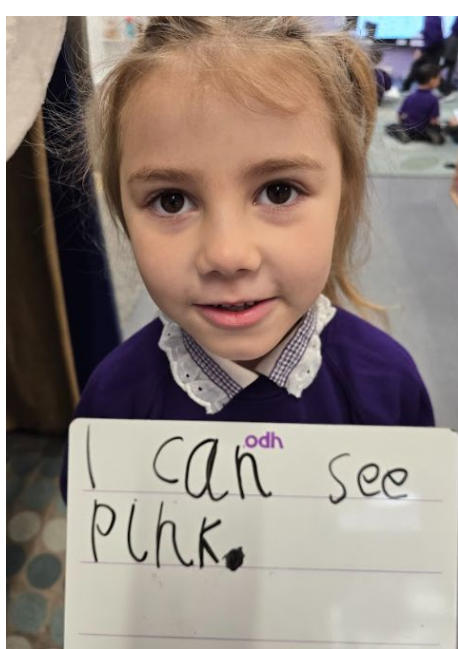


We learnt a bit about Brazil this week. One of the things we talked about was the big carnival and how they love to dance the Samba. We had to try it for ourselves!

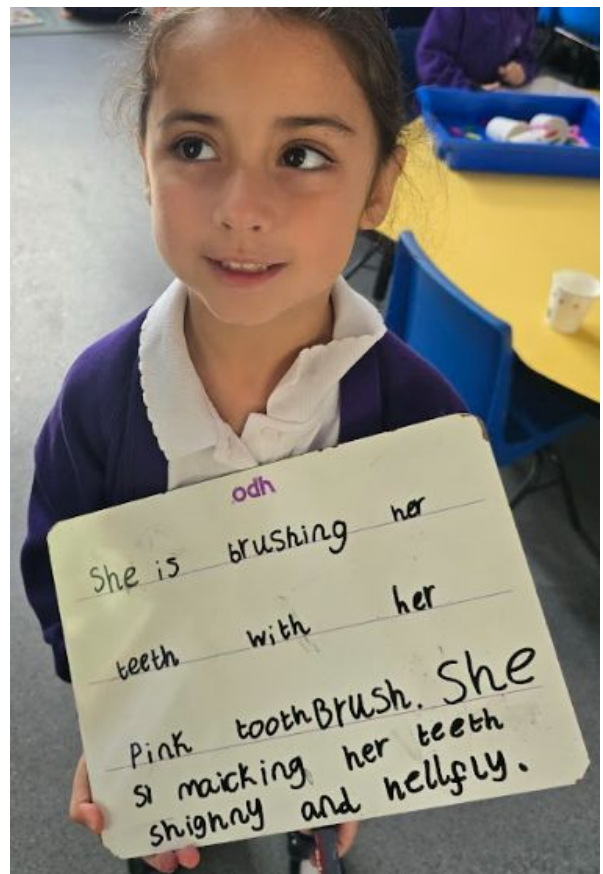
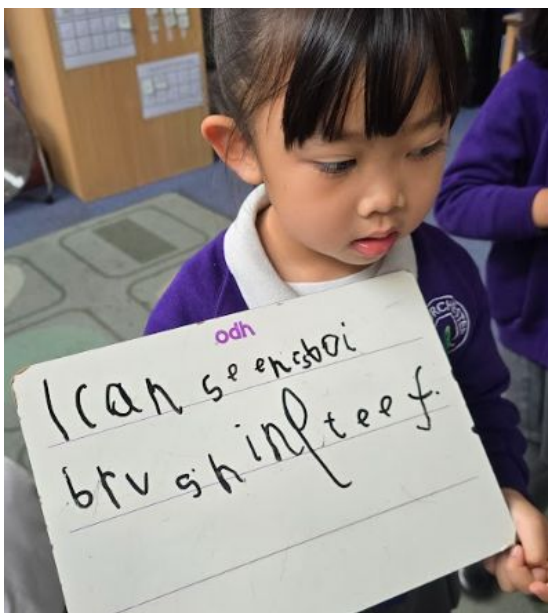


# Bronze Class's superstar assembly about the Solar System. What can you remember?



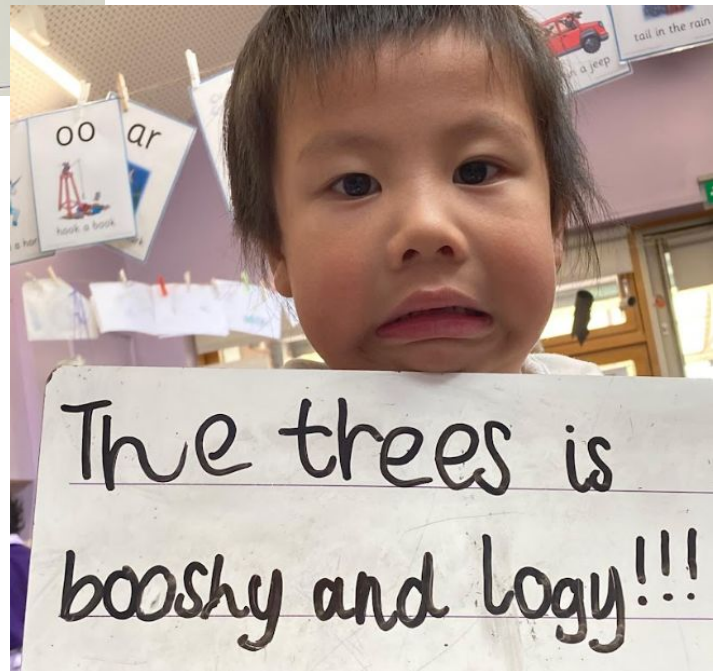

Some of our beans have begun to grow. Can you remember, which bit of the plant grows down and which grows upwards?

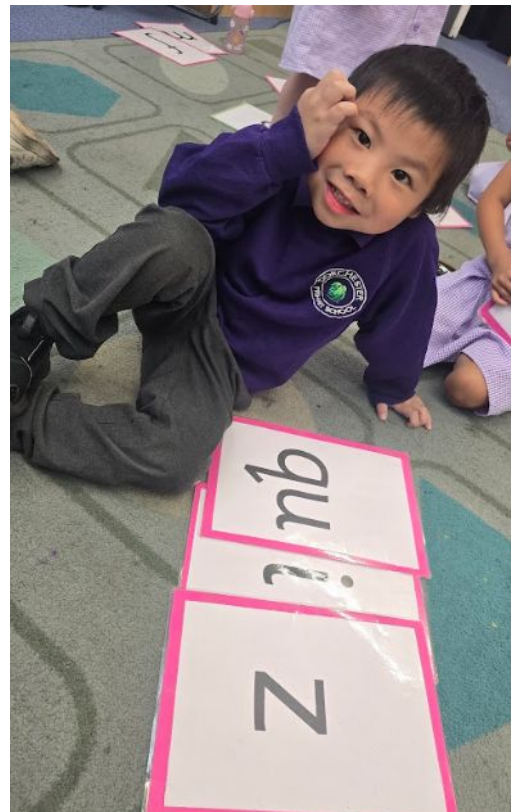
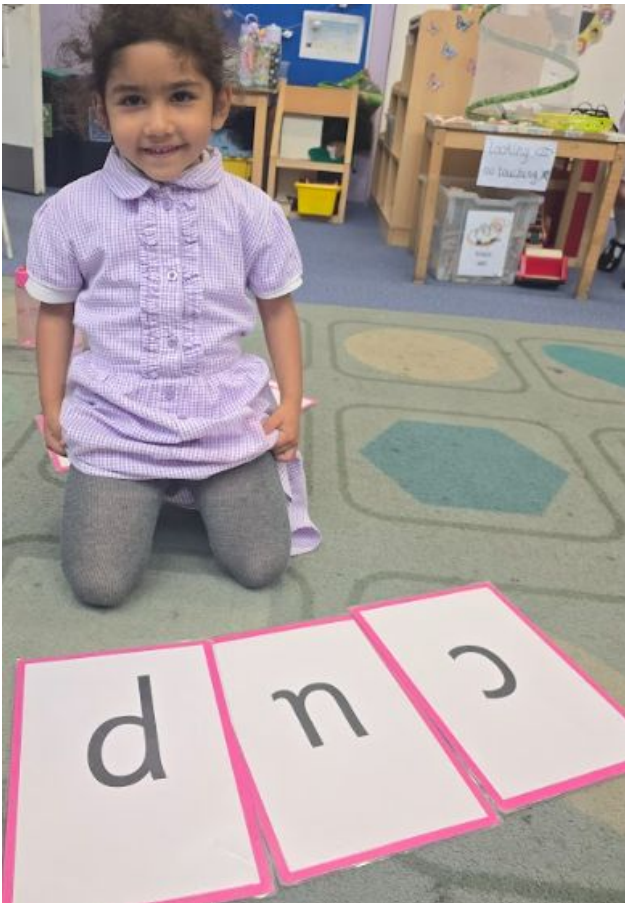


We have been gifted an outdoor kitchen and the children had great fun on 'No Pens Day', making up recipes for a range of soups. What ingredients would you put in a soup?



Also on 'No Pens Day', some of the children got together to make Tower Bridge - one of the recent London landmarks that we learnt about. Which landmark could you make with your body?

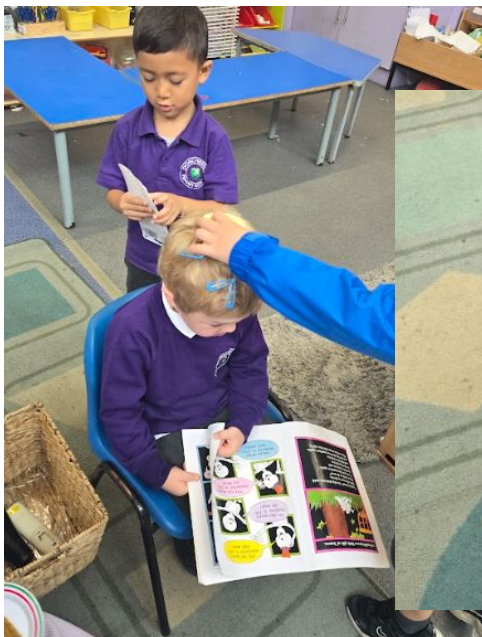
As part of No Pens Day, the children had great fun building words using grapheme cards instead of writing them.
