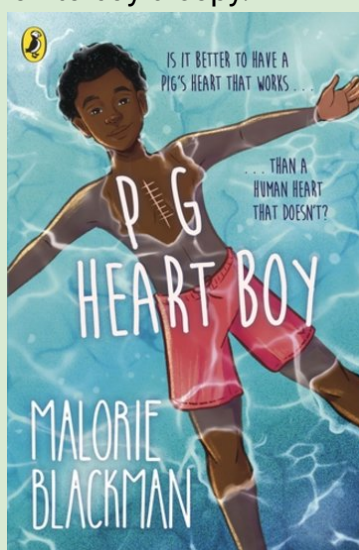

Enquiry Question of the week

Why do we need rainforests?

Gold	Diary of a Rainforest Explorer: Write a first-person journal entry detailing the sweltering heat, incredible sounds, and unexpected wildlife encounters from a hammock camp in the canopy. This should be at least ½ a page.
Silver	Who was Charles Darwin? Imagine you are interviewing him. What questions would you ask him? What might his responses be? Write at least 5 questions and his possible answers.
Bronze	Design a poster that illustrates our key maths vocabulary. Include factors, multiples, product, cube numbers, square numbers and prime numbers too.

Spelling words to learn: (starting next week)

The spelling pattern is: **words ending in -al-** . Examples such as: official, superficial, special, social, racial, crucial,

antisocial, artificial, facial, beneficial

These words will be introduced to the children as part of our Early Morning Work on Monday 21st September. The children will however have access to these words on Friday 18th September on Spelling Shed, allowing them to start completing their homework. The children will then take a Spelling Test on these words the following Monday.
