Dear Parents and Carers,

Class Notes

What was your favourite part of the Wriggly Nativity?

This week the children have had lots of fun performing the Wriggly Nativity. We were all so proud of them, they sang the songs beautifully and joined in with the Makaton actions. We also saw the stars and the animals showing off some of their funky dance moves. The children were able to experience what it is like to perform in front of an audience and this will do wonders for their self-confidence. I am sure we have some actors and dancers in the making! In Nursery, we have been finding out about how different people celebrate Christmas and we have loved using our Advent Calendar to count how many days until Christmas.

What is your favourite part of the Wriggly Nativity, and why?

This was a very exciting week for Reception as the children performed a dress rehearsal of their nativity performance - Wriggly Nativity - in front of the whole school and then, on Wednesday and Thursday they performed, alongside Nursery, to a packed hall of parents. It really was 'standing room only'! They held their own, handled the microphone with aplomb and sang songs using Makaton signing. Scene changes went without a hitch - almost - and they all did themselves proud. They have only been at school for 12 weeks! They were absolutely Reception Superheroes! And while all that was happening, they also learned about shapes with four sides and four angles - some with sides that were the same length and others with two long and two short sides - I wonder if they can remember what they are called? We drew around templates of the shapes and decorated them to hang on the class Christmas tree. The classes are beginning to look really festive. We read the book, Dear Santa by Rod Campbell and, using this as inspiration, we filled our sacks with pictures of toys that we would really like and used our phonics to write down what they are called. On Friday, both classes got together to go to Forest School and toast marshmallows around a fire! What a busy week! I expect everyone will sleep well this weekend!

What do pets need to stay happy and healthy?

This week in English we have been reading 'Little Tree', which is about seasons. We looked at how seasons effect trees and wrote sentences using adjectives to describe the changes.

In Maths we have been learning to subtract using a number line and counting backwards. We have also looked at fact families and writing 4 number sentences for each set of numbers.

In Computing we have been learning to add pages to Googles Slides and in PSHE we have been looking at why we are unique. In Geography we have been looking at maps symbols and creating our own maps of the school.



Class Notes

How many songs are there in our Nativity? Can you remember the names?

This week has included lots of Nativity practising, and the children are very excited to perform to the school this week (Friday 9th Dec) and to all the parents next week (12th and 13th December). They cannot stop singing the songs and speaking their lines, and we hope you will enjoy it as much as they seem to be.

In English, we have looked at some different stories about penguins, to compare similarities and differences between texts. In Maths, we have continued with money by looking at how to find change from different coins and notes. We have compared different values of money, and found many ways to make equal amounts using different coins and notes.

Finally, the children enjoyed their 'Discover Christmas' workshop. They watched a short version of the Nativity, which hopefully helped inspire them for their own version. They then spent some time with the performers in their classrooms, exploring the meaning behind the Wise Men's gifts, singing songs and exploring the emotions of people like Mary during the story.

What makes you unique?

This week in PSHE, we have been looking at what makes each of us unique and have learnt about how these things make us special. We have experimented with different types of magnets to determine whether they can have different strengths and why this may or may not be useful. In DT, we have been working on using nets to build our castles. We have looked at how to make our structures stronger and more stable. In our year groups, we all took part in personal bests week and worked hard to improve on our targets. Both Year 3 and 4 have been applying our knowledge of multiplication and division in order to solve worded problems. In English, Year 4 have continued to read the story of Ocean meets Sky, created our own islands similar to those in the story and used expanded noun phrases to describe them. In Year 3, we looked at retelling a section of The Lost Thing using descriptive phrases, prepositions and conjunctions.

What are gender stereotypes and how can we get rid of them?

We had some really interesting discussions this week about genderstereotypes and the importance of trying to remove them as far as possible to ensure we practise equality and equal opportunities for all. In Maths, we have been starting to add and order fractions, focussing on making denominators the same by making equivalent fractions. In English, we have started drafting our poems which are inspired by the Matchbox Diaries – some poetic structures we have been looking at have been sonnets, ABCB and anaphora. Ask your children this weekend about which they have chosen and have a discussion about similes and metaphors! We are writing up our final science investigations this week too, and have been preparing our flyers to hand out next week on our field trip to raise awareness of putting a stop to plastic pollution.

Who devised the scientific classification system we have today?

Year Six have had a busy week with lots of new learning! Our Junior Supremos have been busy helping every year group in P.E. during 'Personal Best' week; all year six children had a chance to push themselves to achieve their own bests earlier in the week! In Maths we have been focusing on plotting coordinates in four quadrants, reflecting and translating shapes and consolidated some learning with some festive challenges! Ever heard of 'Prep and Landing Elves'? Well, they have very important roles within the 'Elf world'- for which the children have been writing job descriptions and sets instructions to help them successfully execute Christmas Eve preparations for Santa! In P.S.H.E., as part of our 'Living in the Wider World' topic, we explored money sense and in Science, we learned all about the Linnaean Classification system. Finally, in D&T, the children have pinned their waistcoats and have practiced some stitches, ready for next week. The next time you need something mending, you know who to ask!



Safeguarding

Security and Strangers

Your child's class may have been spoken to today about strangers and an awarenss of what to do if they are approached by someone. There was an incident earlier in the week before school where a year 6 pupil was approached and very sensibly ran towards another Dorchester family so that the driver in the van moved on. This has been reported to police and we have spoken to the older children as a precaution to encourage them that "Clever Never Goes" This means that they should never go with anyone, whether they know them or not, unless it is the person they are expecting.

Please have a conversation with your child about how they can keep themselves safe on their route to and form school if they go alone, including asking for help from a grownup with another Dorchester child, going back to school or shouting for help. Please reiterate that if something were to happen in the way to school, they should tell their class teacher or another school adult straight aaway when they arrive and that if they are early, it's ok to come straight to the office to ask for help.

We do not want anyone to be frightened or panicked - the child involved is absolutely fine and I am sharing this with the full permission of their parent. in order that our caring community can all be a little extra cautious over the coming days and weeks.
