#### Dear Parents and Carers,

The end of another academic year is upon us – and what an amazing one it has been. Our children have once again surpassed our expectations in so many ways. We were absolutely delighted with our SATs scores, the standardised national assessments children sit at the end of year 6. Our children achieved above national averages at the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths, with 43% of our children achieving the Higher Standard in Reading and Spelling and Grammar (last year the national figure for this was 28%) and 37% achieving the Higher Standard in Maths (last year's national figure was 22%). These results become even more impressive when you take into account that we are a fully inclusive school with over a third of our Year 6 cohort having a recognised Special Educational Need.

Whilst, of course, our academic outcomes are important, it is our inclusivity that helps our children to become the wonderful young people that they are when they leave us. Our children learn to understand one another, support each others' needs and know that they are heading out into a world where things aren't equal for everyone – and importantly, they want to do something about it. Our Class of 2023 is full of truly remarkable young people who are absolutely ready to take their High Schools by storm – they showed this in spades at their Leavers' Assembly this morning. Keep being yourselves and keep living our school values – you have very bright futures ahead of you.

Parents across the school are always keen to know which High Schools our children head to. Once again this year, our children have had great success in applications to all schools, including those in the independent sector and those with selective entry. Our leavers' destinations this year are:

Before I sign off for the summer, I want to express a huge amount of gratitude to everyone who has supported the school this year. Our Class Reps have done an amazing job, as have our FODS committee and everyone who has supported with organising events. Our Year 6 parents organised a simply brilliant Festival on the Field yesterday, and so much organisation has gone into events like Leavers' Year Books and Hoodies, Mothers' and Fathers' Day Shops and the Christmas and Summer Fairs. We are all excited about the future of FODS and look forward to many more successful events next year when everyone has had a few week's rest!

Of course it is not just the organisation of the events that makes them a success, so thank you to everyone who has donated a toy, bottle, sweetie jar, hamper item, attended an event, or bought a cake or an ice cream – it all makes a difference. We look forward to sharing the difference it will make to our children's playtimes with you next year.

We formed our Dorchester Eco Council creating a team of dedicated, passionate and conscientious eco warriors who met regularly throughout the year to discuss actions to plan for and execute.

We had our Christmas jumper and World Book Day costume swap, where children championed reusing preloved pieces. Helping to reduce waste and encourage the concept of giving products a second life, exchanging out-grown or unused items and finding new ones to wear.

We ran the Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel fortnight, where we encouraged each other to ditch the cars and travel to school by foot or on wheels. This was a great success and we have seen an increase in scooters and bikes in the bike shed. Congratulations to Indigo Class who made the most green journeys to school and won the Gold Trainer Award. Eco Council continued with the eco brick scheme. An ongoing project which will result in building a tree planter and a friendship bench for the playground, in the next academic year.

We have carried on planning future projects which includes expanding our recycling within school. Our fundraising clothing collection, not only stopped lots of clothes from heading to landfill, but helped to generate extra funds for the school.

We introduced Eco Club this year for the first time. It proved to be a great success and we have enjoyed gathering together each week to learn more about our world and how we can help to try and tackle climate change.

We completed a litter pick in our local area, created bug hotels, made wildflower seed bombs and we even made a biodegrade wreath for Remembrance Sunday. We learnt about our local biodiversity, carbon footprints and endangered species we introduced the pen recycling and monitored our paper recycling.

### 2022/23 - Sports Review

### Team Dorchester have had a busy and successful year of sport!

Just under 140 children have represented Dorchester in fixtures or at events including football, netball, gymnastics, cricket, cheerleading, Tchoukball, Ultimate Frisbee, athletics, badminton, basketball, new age kurling, tag rugby, swimming, cross country and skipping.

As usual we entered the boys' and girls' football leagues, with both also playing in the Borough Cup competitions. We had some great results across the teams but our Girls and Year 5 Boys also had impressive Cup runs, both making it through to the semi-final which is a great achievement and we hope to go one better next season! We also had our first Mixed Football fixtures, made more valuable as the concept was the brainchild of some of our Year 6 children who then organised the team themselves. This is something that we will definitely carry forward into future years so those proactive footballers will have left a legacy at Dorchester.

The netball season was also a full programme; the A Team entered the Borough League, staying undefeated until after Christmas, and our mixed B Team who played friendlies alongside those matches were undefeated throughout the entire season. In addition, we fielded a C Team on two occasions, which reflects the large number of children out each week on court. We also had a trip down to Surrey Storm to get inspired, which I think certainly worked, and we'll be looking to do again next year.

Our fabulous Netball A team became Borough Champions at the annual Rally, a gold rush in cricket led to well-deserved winners' medals for our Year 5 and Year 6 cricket teams and a fantastic basketball bronze medal for the Year 5/6 team showed the consistency of our emerging basketball squads. Individual successes on the track and in the pool saw more additions to the overall medal haul for the year; Aiya won the Year 3 girls' 100m at the Borough Athletics and Lorenzo touched first in the Year 5 boys' breaststroke at the Borough Gala, with medals also that night for Juhon, Elenia and Lila. Our amazing Gymnastics Squad also wowed the audience with their polished and professional performance at the Borough Gym and Dance Festival, Dorchester's first appearance at this event for some time.

But Team Dorchester don't just put energy and effort into competing in extra-curricular events, they have also had a varied year with curriculum sport. Year 5 and 6 were treated to some excellent workshops delivered by Urban Strides who honed their street dance techniques. Year 6 also took part in the Schools Mini-Marathon, all setting their own personal challenges aiming to run 2km in their best time. During the year, three excellent Personal Best Weeks have also seen our four Houses go head-to-head in interhouse basketball, benchball, football, rounders and scatterball across the year groups.

This term has concluded with the final intra-school competitions of the year in the form of Sports Days with Reception taking part in a carousel of races and activities and KS2 competing in more traditional track and field events running, jumping and throwing their way to earning points for their Houses.

An important mention and thank you must also go to this year's terrific Year 6 Junior Supremo Sports Leaders. They have been simply excellent in their support and running of intra-school events. They have contributed massively to their success and it has been a pleasure to have them aa part of the PE team this year.

We have had a full and exciting year and it is lovely to be able to reflect on all the achievements of our children, large and small, and to enjoy a moment to be extremely proud of all they have worked for and earned. We've enjoyed every moment!
