DPS Eco






Class Notes

Can you tell me a story?

This week in nursery we have been thinking about different story characters. We have been reading the story of 'The Pirates Next Door.' The children have enjoyed finding out about real life pirates from the past including Blackbeard. The children have also enjoyed drawing different maps to help each other to find hidden treasure. Some of the children have developed this further and drawn their own story maps. For our phonics learning we have been thinking about the initial phonemes in words and enjoyed singing bertha the Bus. In this song all the children organise a zoo and all of the animals that start with the same initial phoneme live together in the zoo, for example the panda, pig, parrot and polar bear).

How do we look after our teeth?

This week in reception we have seen an emotional farewell to our class butterflies. The attached picture is one of our butterflies in the school forest school area. The children have watched them grow from tiny caterpillars and talked about them every day. They have written about their progress and learnt the song 'There's a Tiny Caterpillar on a Leaf', Everyone has been truly captivated by them and the wide variety of bugs found in our outside area from a Hawk Moth, that hitched a ride on a child's shirt, to a tiny green and black striped beetle. Homes have been built and much nurturing done. In Maths we have been working out if a number is odd or even by seeing how many pairs we could make within the number and checking if there was an odd part that did not have a pair. They have been very creative in using blocks to build different configurations and then working it out! The Creative area has been used extensively for observational drawings and paintings of flowers and then dinosaurs. The children have such an eye for detail now.

How are farms an important part of our food chain?

This week, Yellow class and some of Buttercup had a wonderful time at Wimbledon Mosque. It was wonderful to come back to school and see all of the children in Year 2 be able to discuss what they had seen and done on their trip. We also completed a mind map in RE, showing all the different roles an Imam has within the community. In English this week, the children have been writing in the progressive tense. They looked at simple past and present tense ('I run', 'I ran') and turned it into the progressive form ('I am running', 'I was running'). The children were able to apply this skill into lots of different sentences. As well as this, we completed two reading booklets and a SPaG booklet. In Maths, we practised our arithmetic and reasoning skills, before completing two more booklets. We have been very impressed at the effort the children have put into their final Year 2 booklets well done! In Science, we explored how farms are used to support our food chain. In Geography, the children have looked at the climate and habitats in Southern Africa, and how animals there have adapted to these environments. In Art, the children drew a plan for their final tile design, looking at the sculptor Rachel Whiteread for inspiration. In Computing, the children used a spreadsheet to filter important information about our cake thief.



Class Notes

What do you think will happen to the plant in the dark and why?

This week in year 3 and 4, we finished our assessment booklets for the whole year! The children have tried really hard and we are so proud of the effort they have put in. We have also started a new book called Penguin Problems which the children have thoroughly enjoyed. They have been practising their reading skills and retelling the story. In Maths, we have been finishing our learning about symmetry using mirrors. In RE, we have been looking at Karma and how this affects Buddhist's lives and decisions that they make. Our latest Science experiment is to investigate the effects of light on plants. We have currently got one plant in direct sunlight and another in a dark cupboard to see what will happen to them. In Computing, we have been completing each other's Google form surveys to test them and gather data. We have been learning how to deal with difficult situations in PSHE and learning about empathy and tolerance.

What units of measure can you notice and calculate with at home or out and about?

This week in Year5, we have been ploughing on with the fantastic novel 'The Girl of Ink and Stars' and are practising writing powerful and visual setting descriptions for the upcoming star writes. In Maths, we have started a new unit on converting units, focussing on millimetres, centimetres, metres, grams and kilograms – try as much as you can to notice these as you're out and about or just doing odd jobs at home – cooking, measuring, all real life examples will really help children put these types of number conversions into context. In Science, we learnt about how we have day and night based on the rotation of the earth in relation to the sun. In PSHE, we have been looking at how to analyse news and be able to determine whether a news source is credible or not, but also researching and learning more about Pride. Thanks again to all parents and carers who were able to attend the wonderful Year 5 assembly on Monday, they really did a superb job – there were tears in the audience! In RE, we learnt about the Jewish festival Purim and why it is special for the religion of Judaism.

Which is your favourite scene of the Year 6 play?

Our Geography topic about Dorset is enabling lots of map skills to develop, and we have been using Ordnance Survey maps to support understanding of 6 figure grid references. We have also been exploring 8 and even 16 compass points on maps to enable more precise directions to be given. The children have enjoyed making their own maps of parts of the playground and trim trail, using a compass for direction and a ruler to measure scale. Drawing objects from a bird's-eye view was definitely a challenge. In Science, we have been examining food packaging to help understand the nutritional value of certain types of food and researching some of the main nutrients to consider the effect on our hearts. Of course, play rehearsals are in full swing with the added excitement of costumes, which has enhanced children's individual performances, as they begin to really get to grips with how their character speaks and acts. It has been exciting to use all the props and lighting too. The play is really coming together, and we are eagerly anticipating our performances to both the children in school on Monday and parents and carers on Tuesday evening.

Supporting Children's Safety

Do influencers have an impact on a child's behaviour?

Experts, Dr Elizabeth Milovidov and Lauren Seager-Smith, discuss how influencers might affect pre-teens online and what parents can do to support them.



Social media influencers can bring excitement and inspiration into the lives of tweens and preteens as they share their experiences online with well-designed settings, scripts, and oftentimes spontaneity. Influencers, like celebrities, can have either a negative or positive influence on their young audiences, and it is crucial that children and young people are able to think critically about what they are viewing.

As Internet Matters ambassador and psychologist Dr. Linda Papadopoulos advises, there are potential negative effects that influencers can have on a child's self-esteem, body image and understanding of 'real life'. As with negative influences in real life (such as young children smoking or engaging in inappropriate behaviour), parents and carers can counter those influences by having open and transparent conversations with their children. Having conversations that improve critical thinking and digital literacy about what children experience online is one of the best ways to support them in the digital environment.

Ideal conversation starters for parents and carers include:

- Do you understand that what you are seeing online is not always true?
- Does the influencer make money if they have more views, more likes or more clicks?
- Does the influencer's lifestyle reflect real life?
- How much time do you think the influencer spent to make that video?
- What is the purpose of the video? Why are they talking about this subject?
- How do you feel when you watch the influencer (anxious, fear of missing out, inspired, etc.)?
- How can you choose influencers to watch who make you feel positive?
