## **Class Notes**

### Say Hello to the Snowy Animals

This week in Nursery we have been continuing to find out about different animals. We have read the book 'Say Hello to the Snowy Animals' by Ian Whybrow. In this book we follow the husky through the snow and ice as he meets a polar bear, a seal, a caribou and an arctic hare. The children have enjoyed finding out about these animals and where they live. We have found out that lots of these animals have white fur to camouflage in the snow. The children have also enjoyed exploring real ice and experimenting to try and make it melt. For our Phonics learning we have been thinking about the initial phonemes for each of these animals and we have been practising our oral blending too. We have also made some bunting for our coronation celebration and begun to talk about what the coronation is and why it is happening. Next week we will continue to learn more about the coronation and the children will be encouraged to talk about their experiences of coronation celebrations.

#### We Completely Must Go to London

This week the Reception children have been learning about landmarks around London. We read the book 'We Completely Must Go to London' by Lauren Childs, and joined Charlie and Lola as they went with their classmates to see Big Ben, Buckingham Palace, The London Eye, Nelson's Column in Trafalgar Square and other places. We have been building landmarks outside and creating a river, so we could build Tower Bridge over it. Some children have drawn pictures of places that they saw in the book or might have visited, such as the London Eye or the Tower of London. In maths, we have been learning about Spacial Reasoning. The children were using their reasoning to skills to work out why a shape might be the odd one out in a group or explaining what shape was missing in a picture and choosing the correct one to fill the space. All of this is a good grounding for completing jigsaw puzzles and making tessellations - which they will be doing next week!

We have been busy making bunting for the Coronation Celebrations on Friday afternoon. We have talked about the Coronation and some of the children know they will be having street parties at the weekend. We will be learning about the Coronation in more depth next week, when the children will have had a chance to experience the celebrations.

### What is a collage? How will we create one?

This week the children have been amazing. They have been so sensible and positive towards their first set of SATs booklets, and now most of the children have finished both Reading papers - well done Year 2! Around the booklets, the children have had time to look at some other reading comprehension tasks about the Great Fire of London, as well as looking at a newspaper report on the event. In Science, the children have investigated the key things that animals need to survive, and we explored the difference between survival and health/happiness. In Art, the children created textured paper that they will be using to make their collages next week, using the artist Romare Bearden (pictured above) as inspiration. In PSHE, we discussed what makes a good friend. In History, the children debated whether the Great Fire of London destroyed or improved it.



### **Class Notes**

#### What were the pros and the cons of the industrial revolution between 1750 and 1900?

We had some really beautiful and informative posters produced in History this week all about the industrial revolution this week; the children were fascinated to find out just how revolutionary the invention of the steam engine was to the world!

In Maths, we have been looking at line graphs, how to draw them and how to accurately interpret them, taking care to read their axis and intervals to find answers to problems relating to different data sets.

In English, the week is culminating with everyone completing their star writes, which are focused on the famous scene from Oliver Twist; the targets for writing have been to use a balance of speech and narrative as well as detailed description – we look forward to reading these!

We wish everyone a fantastic school journey to Kingswood next week, and to those staying in school there are also fantastic things planned for you so you are not missing out!

### What are you looking forward to in Year 6, after SATS?

We are so proud of the sensible attitudes that the children have been displaying this week, towards SATs next week. We have been engaged in a lot of practice this week, and the way they have been approaching this, is admirable. They have shown great resilience, perseverance and great senses of humour too, as we revise everything that they know from right across their time in primary school. We have also been learning and practising songs for our end of year production and the children have really enjoyed this. The coronation of King Charles III has also featured heavily this week, with discussions about the line of succession, the history behind the coronation and how different this will be to that of the late Queen in 1953.

### School-age friendships

Your child's world gets bigger when they start school. Relationships with other people – like the children in your child's class at school – become more important.

Friendships are good for your school-age child's self-esteem. When your child has close friends, your child feels like they belong. Your child's friends care about your child, and this helps your child feel good about themselves.

Friendships also help children develop important life skills like getting along with other people and sorting out conflicts and problems. Children with these skills are less likely to have social and emotional difficulties later in life.

### Key points

- Friendships give school-age children a sense of belonging. They also build children's self-esteem and develop their social skills.
- Support friendships by getting to know children's friends and organising playdates.
- For friendship troubles, try reminding children about social cues and the rules of games. School buddy systems can also help.
- If you're concerned about children's friendships, it's good to talk with classroom teachers.
