Dear Parents and carers,

As at every holiday, it was wonderful to welcome the children back to school on Monday. They have returned well rested and eager to learn and have embraced their new curriculum topics and challenges with great enthusiasm. We hope you had a wonderful break.

As ever, we 'hit the ground running' in school with so much already going on. Rose Class visited the Tower of London yesterday and had a brilliant time learning about what life would have been like in the castle in the past. I was lucky enough to accompany the visit and the children really impressed me with their curiosity and questions – we had to leave with so much more they wanted to see and talk about – a day is not long enough – although the children and adults were pretty exhausted by the end of the day. This morning Year 3 have been out to enjoy the brilliant music of the London Philharmonia, a world-class symphony orchestra normally based at the Royal Festival Hall, that works worldwide giving concerts, making recordings, and being leaders in using digital technology. The children were treated to some beautiful live music from the string quintet from the Philharmonia. #### What animals live on the farm? Can you remember what some of the baby animals are called?

This week in Nursery we have been thinking about different animals that live on the farm. We have been reading the story of *Farmyard Hullabaloo by Giles Andreae*. The children have learnt what each of the farm animals are called and they have learnt the vocabulary for the baby animals too. The children have been developing their fine motor skills by milking the cows in our outside area and making play dough farm animals. They have also made their own animal puppets and they have been washing some of the dirty animals. We have also been learning about all of the different jobs that the farmer has to do to look after the animals, including picking up poo!

#### What is fasting? How would a Muslim use a prayer mat?

This week in reception we have immersed ourselves in learning about Ramadan and Eid. We read the book Samira's Eid, about a family's preparations for the upcoming Eid celebrations and how Samira learnt that helping others is not just about giving money to a charity but is also about doing things for people, such as tidying a garden when a neighbour has a broken arm, or making food to take to a community centre to help feed people less fortunate than she is. We were lucky enough to have a prayer mat in each class to look at closely. The children saw pictures of mats being used to pray and they practised themselves. We made crescent moon shaped sun catchers using petals and leaves, because the crescent moon is a symbol of Islam and the sighting of the New Moon at the end of Ramadan is important for the start of Eid, as well as for the start of Ramadan itself. We were so lucky to have some Muslim families who brought gifts for the children to celebrate and one Mummy came in to show us a few different ways to wear a hijab. We have a some scarves in the classroom and the children practised themselves. On Wednesday we made cookies in many different shapes associated with Islam or the countries where it is widely practised. We had shapes such as a crescent moon, a star, a camel and mosque. We also learnt that the meal that breaks the daily fast is called Iftar and that many families break the fast by eating dates, just as the Prophet Muhammad did when he broke the fast a thousand years ago. It has been an exciting week and the children and staff learnt a lot together.

In maths we have been learning about numbers bigger than 10. We have been making numbers 11-20 using a variety of resources that helped to show that 10 is a part of all those numbers. We will be investigating that further next week.

In phonics we are continuing to learn how to use all the sounds we know both in our reading and writing.

#### What does past tense mean?

This week Year 1 have been learning about verbs and past and present tense in English. We have been learning how to add the 'ed' suffix to make a verb present tense.

In Maths, we have been learning to count larger numbers by adding the 10s first. We have then been practising partitioning the numbers into tens and ones.

In Computing we recapped how to create Sprites suing Scratch Junior. In Science, we have been looking at weather forecasts and how to record them. In DT, we have been learning the difference between fruits and vegetables and in Geography, we have been learning the different continents and where they are in relation to the oceans.



#### What happened during the Great Fire of London?

This week in English Year 2 have looked at Sammy the Street Dog as a text to develop the children's understanding of the Great Fire of London. The children have been practising writing different types of descriptive sentences, which will help them in creating a setting description next week. We also looked at the event in more detail through our History, and the children were able to create a timeline of the event. In Maths, we have been looking at the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, and looked at how to sort them based on their different properties. In Science this week, we investigated how animals change as they grow into adults. The children drew a life cycle of either a butterfly or a duck, to help them describe these physical changes. In Art, the children impressed us with their knowledge of primary and secondary colours, and they were successfully able to mix these colours to make the secondary colours. In R.E. we have begun our topic on Islam, as we talked about what Muslims believe about Allah. In PSHE, we looked at the important people in our lives, and the children listened very well as they described to each other who those different people were. We have also spent some Computing time on the iPads this week, using Scratch Jr, which will help the children as we begin our project on making a storybook next week.

#### Welcome back year 5! What have you enjoyed most about being back in school?

This week we have been working hard on planning our writing in English, which will be a piece of descripitive writing set in the early chapters of our new book this term, 'Oliver Twist', the classic by Charles Dickens. This all sets off our amazing new topic of the Victorians for this term. Reminder! Victorian dress up and interactive WOW day is Monday 15<sup>th</sup> May. Get your outfits ready!

In Maths, we have started looking at area and perimeter of shapes and are having some great fun problem solving with these.

In Science, we are looking at lifecyels of flowers and how sexual reproduction takes places amongst flowers – we learnt that bees and other flying insects contribute approximately £100,000,000 to the economy every year for the amazing job they do with pollinating plants – wow!

In PSHE, we have been having interesting and useful debates about how to lead a healthy lifestyle, and look after both your physical and mental health.

#### What shocked you most about Britain immediately after the war?

In Year 6 we have begun our new History topic this week, which follows on from our prior learning about World War Two. We look at Britain since the war and how it has become the country we live in today. The children have been finding out about the creation of the NHS and how valuable this part of British culture is. We have also been looking at the changes since it's birth in 1948 and some of the career options within the NHS. In Maths, we have been revising various areas of learning and combining some to solve problems. In English, we have focused heavily on Grammar and Reading and the children are becoming much more confident and aware of the need to work efficiently. But the big excitement of the week, has definitely been Auditions for our summer production of 'Aladdin Trouble'. Approximately half of each class volunteered to try out for a part in the play and have acted and sung solo in front of some of the Year 6 staff. We are very proud of them, as this takes a lot of courage. Once final deliberations are completed, the results will be announced and rehearsals can begin.



## Safeguarding

#### Supporting Children's Safety

#### A warning for anyone with a second or hidden phone or device who may be at risk if the device is found:

A Government alert is set to automatically sound on mobile devices on April 23rd. This is to test a new system intended to be used in life-threatening situations. The alerts will appear on the home screens of a phone accompanied with a loud warning sound and vibration. The scheme will initially focus on the most severe weather-related events.

There is fear within the Domestic Abuse sector that this alert may reveal hidden second phones that victims/survivors of domestic abuse might keep for emergency use. The use of second phones is common, and the alert poses a potential risk to their safety.

Cranstoun.org have put together a video demonstrating how people who are victims/survivors of domestic abuse can silence the device safely. The only way to ensure that this is done safely is to turn the alert off via settings, the videos in the link below outline how this can be done. The alert will also go to tablet devices that use 4G or have any form of mobile data.
