### A, B, C Netball vs St Mary's



outside the school office where the children can deposit their used batteries.


We will eventually have a designated recycling area with: pens, batteries and crisp packets recycling with a book swap station too!

### **Class Notes**

#### What is your amazing superpower?

This week in Nursery we have been reading the story 'Ten Rules of being a Superhero' by Deb Pilutti. We have learnt that superheroes help people but there are lots of other things that they need to do too. Saving the day can be messy, but superheroes need to clean up the mess after them. Superheroes need to use their powers for good and they need to eat healthy food to keep up their energy. They also need to rest to re-charge. Superheroes are not brave all of the time and we can all have different superpowers like being friendly or funny or having a good imagination. The children have all been thinking about their own superpowers. The children were all very upset when they found out that the Green Goblin had taken their favourite Spiderman toy so they have all written some fantastic letters (using very meaningful marks) to ask for him to be returned. They have also been practising their name writing to let the Green Goblin know that they all want the Spiderman toy back. For our Maths learning we have been using resources to find out what 1 more than a number is. The children have been using this knowledge to unlock padlocks to rescue their favourite toys. We are all looking forward to our Superhero day after half term where we can all use our superpowers to help each other.

#### How would you subtract or take away in Maths? Can you give me an example?

This week in Reception we been reading 'The Three Little Pigs' story, but this time we were learning to retell the story using Makaton signs. The children were amazing at doing the signs and narrating the story at the same time, maybe they can show you.

In Maths, we have been learning about spatial reasoning. We looked at how we can use shapes to make different shapes. On the tables we have been practising how to 'take away' through a game called 'Smashing Subtraction'.

The children showed incredible fine motor skills, when they made their salt paintings.

For writing, the children have been carrying out early morning work, in which they have been writing different sentences using the pictures shown on the board. We have also been using our phonics to write sentences about things that interest us.

### What are the physical and human features of Tocuaro?

The children have all worked really hard this term in and we are sure are looking forward to a well deserved break! We have been so impressed at seeing how well their Phonics is doing and the improvements in their reading - Well done Year 1.

In English this week we have been reading 'Pirate Mums'. We have been learning about conjunctions and have been using 'and' and 'because' to extend our sentences. In Maths, we have begun looking at multiplication and have been practising counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Computing we have been learning how to stay safe online and the importance of keeping personal information private. The children enjoyed learning about how temperature changes through the seasons in Science and in Geography they made some brilliant comparisons of the physical and human features in Worcester Park to Tocuaro in Mexico.

We were very lucky to have Nabhi visit us on Tuesday and explain to us all about his Hundu faith.

## **Class Notes**

### What have your star writes been about and what have you included?

This week in Year 3&4, we have used our observational skills to draw botanical drawings inspired by scientific sketches. We used real flowers and dissected them to sketch each part individually. In Geography, we created topic pages showing the changes that have occurred in Worcester Park over the last 50 years, explained why these have happened and how they have benefitted the local community. For our topic of Buddhism, we have explored the Buddhist temple and the Four Noble Truths to better understand Buddhists' beliefs. In Science, we have explored the life cycle of a plant and how each part has a different function. In Maths, Year 3 have learnt to tell the time to the nearest second and have used 8 points of the compass to investigate angles. Year 4 have been learning about money and have been converting between pounds and pence.

#### What did you find most interesting about the life and work of Jane Goodall?

This week, Year 5 have spent lots of time writing up their wonderfully persuasive letters as their star writes – this is some of the best writing we have seen all year and we are all really impressed with the efforts that everyone has put in!

In Science, we have been researching and learning about the life of Jane Goodall and her importance in the conservation of chimpanzees in the wild. In Maths, we have finished our unit on negative numbers and focussed on more mental maths towards the end of the week. IN PSHE, we learnt about the negative and positive effects of advertising and how they should require closer scrutiny before believing everything which is trying to be sold to us!

We wish everyone a safe and restful half term – please remember to wear sun cream!

#### Which has been your favourite decade since WW2?

This week, Year 6 have been completing their Star Write, based on a short video, 'Alma'. We have explored various suspense techniques and how authors use them to draw the reader in and to 'hook' them. The children have worked hard to include some of these, and we are all proud of their results. This week also sees the end of our History topic about Britain since the second world war. In pairs, the children chose a decade to research and they have presented their findings in a 'double page spread', showcasing a timelines of major events, two aspects of British life and a short biography of someone famous from that decade. They have chosen people like David Bowie, Maragaret Thatcher, David Beckham and Paul McCartney and considered their influence on British life. Play rehearsals have been continuing this week, and we have been working on ensuring children understand the humour behind some of their lines. After half term, we begin acting too!



## Safeguarding

#### **Supporting Children's Safety**

We know children love spending time outdoors, whether in the garden, park or beach, however, their skin is more delicate than an adult's and can easily be damaged by the sun, even when it doesn't seem strong.





Use a sunscreen with a minimum SPF 50 and at least 4 stars for UVA protection.



Wear sunglasses, ideally with wrap around lenses or wide arms, which carry CE and British Standard marks.



Reapply every two hours or immediately after swimming or sweating.



No sunscreen offers
100% protection so
cover up with loose
close weave clothing
(such as cotton) and a
wide brimmed hat to
protect the neck, ears
and face.



Generously apply sunscreen (5 teaspoons to cover the whole body) 15 to 20 minutes before going out. Seek shade between
11am – 3pm when the
sun is at its strongest.
Always keep babies
and toddlers in the
shade if you can.



By following these simple tips your child will be able to stay safe and enjoy the sun. Remember parents, set your child a good example by also following this advice, and the whole family can have a happy sun safe summer.
