
Dip and Do


These are some ideas of things that you may like to do to support your child's learning at home.


- Can you sing the nursery rhymes you have learnt this week?
 - Can you learn a new nursery rhyme?
 - Can you do a job to help someone at home?
- Who are your friends at nursery? Why are they good friends?
 - Can you draw a picture or make a gift for your friends?

What have we been doing in Nursery?

3-a-day Stories: The children have learnt our last 3 a day stories really well. These are our new 3 a day stories for this half term:







Please show your child these pictures and encourage them to talk about them.





We have been using small world toys and puppets to sing our nursery rhymes. We have been talking about the words of the rhymes and exploring the new vocabulary.

Who went up the hill?

What is a pale?

What is a crown?

What happened when the clock struck 2, 3 and 4?

Rhymes are fantastic vocabulary boosters. They often feature a pleasing rhythmic pattern and simple repetitive phrases that young children find easy to remember and repeat. In order to develop their phonological awareness, children need to be repeatedly exposed to spoken language

We have also been using playdough to make different nursery rhymes characters. Remember playing with playdough is very important to strengthen our finger muscles for writing.

Can you make a playdough nursery rhyme character? We would love to see photographs!

We have been thinking about different body parts when we sing head, shoulders, knees and toes. We have been role-playing as doctors to use the vocabulary in a context.

Maybe you could role-play doctors at home. What do doctors do? What body part might they need to look at?



For our maths learning, we have been thinking about capacity- how much something can contain. We have been filling different size buckets to see what we can fit inside. The children have also been exploring bucket scales to use the vocabulary of heavy and light.

Maybe you could use some different containers and water at home. Which container holds the most water? Which container holds the least water?
