Diwali and Nursery Rhyme Week

This week that children have been learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali. They have used a wide range of materials to make our own rangoli patterns - chalk on the floor outside, coloured rice and stencils. We learnt about how a family prepares for Diwali and who celebrates it. We watched the traditional story of Rama and Sita and learned how they needed light from special lamps - Diva lamps - to light their way home. We made our own diva lamps with clay which we will decorate next week.

This week was World Nursery Rhyme Week. The children have been learning rhymes, and some of them have been a bit different to the normal versions, so there has been a lot of laughter as we joined in together to sing them.

In maths we have learnt about how many are left when we have 1 less of something. We sang the rhyme Five Little Speckled Frogs and calculated how many were left as each frog jumped into the pool.


Early Birds - Fine Motor Skills


