
Peek at the Week



Hanukkah

This week we have learnt about the Jewish festival Hanukkah and we have read the story 'The First Night of Hanukkah'. We heard how, long ago, after a wicked King had destroyed their temple, some brave men fought off the King's men and set about cleaning up their temple. They went to light the 7 branched candlestick, which was supposed to burn every day in the temple, but there was only a small amount of oil left, enough for just one day. They lit it and a rider went on a long journey to get some more. After riding for four days there and four days back, a

miracle happened. The oil had not gone out after one day. It carried on burning for eight days. So every Hanukkah, Jews celebrate their victory by lighting a Hanukkiah - an eight branched candlestick, and by eating food cooked in oil, like donuts and potato pancakes. We also learnt a song called One Little Candle, which the children will sing in assembly next week, wearing candle flame hats that they have made.



We have also been practising writing short words, using the sounds we are learning. In Maths we have been finding circles and triangles and have begun to describe both shapes using mathematical language, such as, the line around a circle is called a circumference and a triangle has three sides and three angles. We also found out that a triangle does not have to sit on a side, to be a triangle. It can be any

way up!

Can you go on a shape hunt around your house? We would love to see photos of what you find.

On Friday we were very lucky to meet a couple of Christmas Donkeys. We learnt that donkeys originally lived in deserts can you find out which deserts donkeys come from?
