THE NORTHERN LIGHTS READING COMPREHENSION - STANDARD Qs

Question One (2 Marks)

1 mark for appropriate reference to the Northern Lights <u>OR</u> Earth's Magic

E.g. I think it is known as the Northern Lights as the lights are commonly seen in the countries in the Northern area.

I think it is known as Earth's Magic as the scenes in the sky are thought to be magical, particularly as they are not always seen.

2 marks for an appropriate explanation of both the Northern Lights and Earth's Magic as above.

Question Two (2 Marks)

1 mark for identifying personification example

a beautiful celestial dance performed high up

2 marks identifying example and explaining what it suggests

E.g. A beautiful celestial dance performed high up suggests that the lights moved in a magnificent way that looked like something that was rehearsed and wanted to be seen by others.

Question Three (1 Mark)

1 mark for a relevant explanation

E.g. because her name meant 'light' which is fitting to describe the Northern Lights/Aurora Borealis as they create colours of light in the sky.

 \overline{OR} her name means the dawn and the lights could be representing the rising sun

Question Four (2 Marks)

1 mark for each of the following points

E.g. The lights in the sky looked like they moved elegantly.

The lights looked like they were making small waves in the sky.

Question Five (1 Mark)

1 mark for identifying the correct phrase

(the exact colours that everyone sees) varies from person to person

Question Six (1 Mark)

1 mark for ticking the two correct answers

'Halo's are in an oval shape.'

'It shows there is a glow around the North Pole.'

Question Seven (2 Marks)

1 mark for an appropriate feeling/reaction. 1 mark for supporting evidence.

Impression – amazed/surprised

Evidence – some of the photos were described as stunning.

They appear as a luminescent corona which would be incredible to see.

Question Eight (2 Marks)

1 mark for two correct phrases or 2 marks for three correct phrases from the following:

She describes you as being 'lucky' if you get to see the lights

They are described as 'breath-taking'

It is described as spectacular

She describes the lights as 'a beautiful celestial dance'

It dazzles and intrigues

Described as jaw-dropping

Described as fascinating

Described as amazing

Described as brilliant and mesmerising

Suggests if you see the lights, you might believe in magic

Question Nine (1 Mark)

1 mark for matching the terms and definitions correctly

expanse - a wide continuous area of something

bejewelled - decorated with or as if with jewels

transforms - undergo a marked change

ethereal - extremely delicate and light in a way that seems not be of this world

Question Ten (2 Marks)

1 mark for a simple response with no elaboration

E.a. Yes if you were fortunate to view the lights.

No because it is rare that you actually see the lights.

2 marks for two different points or one point with evidence

E.g. Yes because if you get to see the lights, they are incredible as they are described as a beautiful celestial dance across the sky.

Yes as they are described as jaw-dropping and it is so incredible, that the author suggests you might believe in magic after all.



Answer for no could be some of the following – it is rare to see them, the colours appear different to everyone so some people may not find them fascinating, there are only a few months where you can get a good view.
