Africa/Warm Colours

This week in Reception we have been learning all about summer, and places where you will find warm weather like Africa. We used a world map to have a look at where Africa is. We spoke about the difference between a continent and a country.

We have been painting using warm colours to show where the African animals live. We have also been developing our fine motor skills, by cutting out pictures of the animals to stick on top. The children have been using their phonic sounds to independently write what their superpower is.

In Maths, we have been finding and representing the numbers 6,7 and 8. We have introduced 10 frames and the children have had great fun using stamps to represent 6,7 and 8.



Please Read Every Night

The children can collect 2 stickers a week for their bookmarks. 1 sticker is for having books in school every day and the other is for reading daily. We only know that reading is happening if the Reading Record is filled in. The children LOVE to collect their stickers! Please read every night.



Dip and Do

Your child has been sent home with their first set of tricky word flash cards. Please practise these at home.

Tricky words are words that cannot easily be decoded ('sounded out' and read). This is because some of the sounds in the words are spelled in an unusual way. It is important for children to be able to read these words as they are among the most common words in English.

Mystery Reader!

Come and read to your child's class at the end of the day. Any member of the family can come and the children love it! Bronze Class have had two mystery readers so far and Silver Class are awaiting for volunteers. If you would like to volunteer please secretly talk to or email your class teacher.

Remember – DON'T TELL YOUR CHILD! This is to be a surprise for them too!


