This week's learning



Dip and Do


These are some ideas of things that you may like to do to support your child's learning at home.


- Can you find out what your family members do at work? What is their job? Can you bring in a photograph?

- Can you draw a picture of the animals in the 'Great Race'? Alternatively, maybe you can make them out of


playdough.

- Can you practise writing your name? You could do this with a pen or with your finger in flour or maybe with a paintbrush and water.






















We had a very special visit from Yippy (our Lolli pop person). The children enjoyed learning about what Yippy does and how she helps the children to safely cross the road.

Was it tricky to use? Why?




Important Dates
