

Nursery Peek at the Week

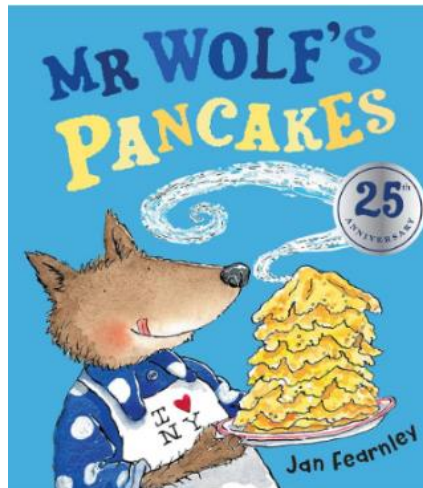
This week's learning

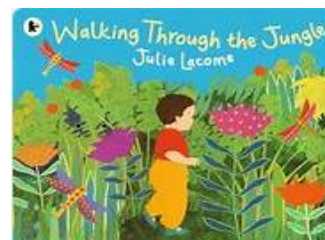
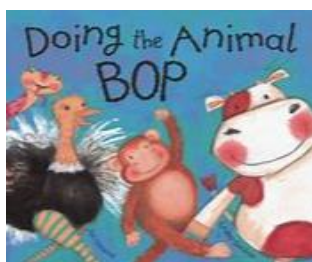
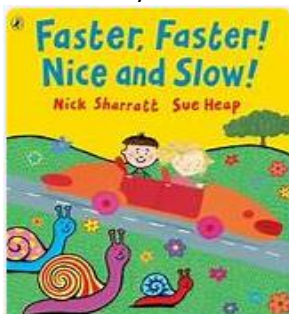

Dip and Do

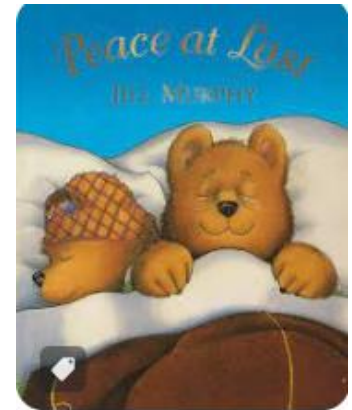
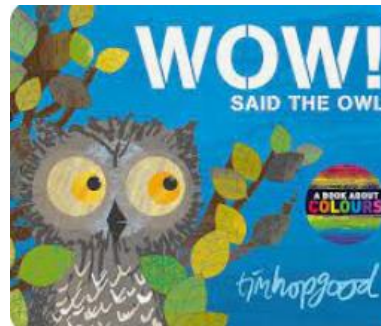
These are some ideas of things that you may like to do to support your child's learning at home.

- Can you find out what your family members do at work? What is their job? Can you bring in a photograph?
 - Can you make some pancakes and show us how you made them?
 - Can you do your own zip up on your coat?
 - Can you read one of our 3 a day stories? Maybe you can make some puppets for the story.
- Can you practise writing your name? You could do this with a pen or with your finger in flour or maybe with a paintbrush and water.

New 3-a-day Stories for Ollie group children: These are stories that the children hear every day. These stories have been carefully chosen to help the children to develop a love of reading and to help them to develop early reading skills. These stories have key elements that support the children to retell them for example many of them use rhyme or repeated phrases.
