## **Enquiry Question**

What is the journey of a river from source to mouth? River Severn case study.

A: A river has three main stages: upper course, middle course and lower course (children to go into detail with each stage). As rivers travel they become slower, wider and deeper. When they flow more quickly, they transport more sediment; when they travel more slowly, they deposit this sediment (creating meanders and oxbow lakes). Almost all rivers end their journey by reaching a sea or an ocean, where deltas and estuaries are formed.
