Enquiry Question of the week

How do we create an algorithm?

An algorithm is a set of instructions that a machine will follow. This week the children were exploring how this works, by using the Bee Bots. The children had to use the direction buttons on the Bee Bots and ensure that it travelled to the correct location on our Toy Shop mat.

Year 2 Home Learning - "Dip and Do"

You must:

Silver	Our PSHE question next week is 'How do we change as we get older?' Can you write a list of ways animals and humans change as they grow? For example, what are some of the differences between a baby and an adult?
Bronze	As we have Maths booklets next week, can the children please spend some extra time on Numbots and TTRS to practise their number skills.

Spelling words to learn: metal, petal, capital, hospital, animal, equal, final, pedal, local, magical
