### **This week's learning**

This week in nursery we been reading the story of Sam's Sandwich. In this story Sam helps his little sister to make a sandwich and she includes some delicious fillings like cheese, egg and tomato but unbeknown to her Sam includes some disgusting surprises including tadpoles, spiders and worms.



We have had lots of fun designing and making our own sandwiches but we have not included any disgusting surprises.

For our maths learning we have been focusing on the language of heavy and light. To link this to real life situations we tried to carry our shopping with all of the sandwich ingredients inside. One bag was very heavy but one was lighter. We also weighed some of our toys using bucket scales.



We have also been learning all about different ways to make number 3 e.g. 1 and 1 and 1 make 3, 2 and 1 make 3, 3 and 0 makes 3.

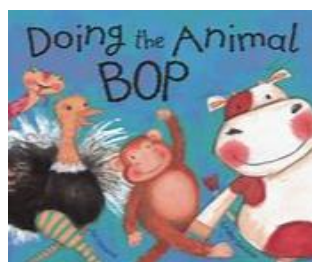
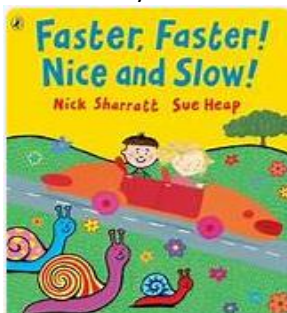

### Dip and Do

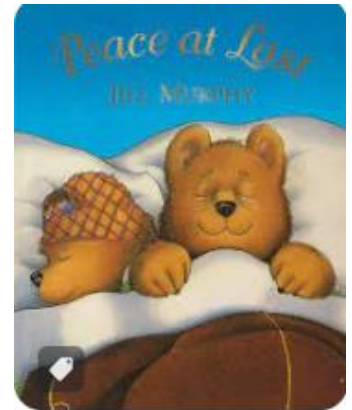
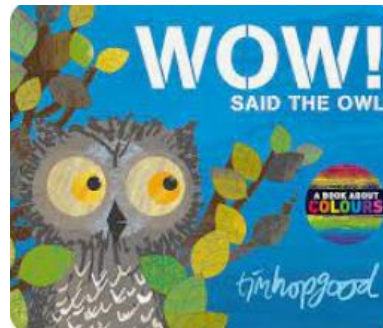
These are some ideas of things that you may like to do to support your child's learning at home.

- Can you find a heavy toy at home and can you find a light toy at home? Maybe send us in some photographs.
- In phonics we have learnt the phonemes s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d and g (the children have learnt how to say these phoneme sounds and to identify them at the beginning of the word; they are not expected to know the what the grapheme (letter) looks like until Reception but some children are starting to make these links). Can you find objects that begin with these phonemes?
  - Can you make your own sandwich at home? What do you need to remember?
- Can you find different ways to make 3? You could use your fingers, you could draw pictures or you could use toys. We would love to see some photographs.

**New 3-a-day Stories for Ollie group children:** These are stories that the children hear every day. These stories have been carefully chosen to help the children to develop a love of reading and to help them to develop early reading skills. These stories have key elements that support the children to retell them for example many of them use rhyme or repeated phrases.
