### This week's learning

This week in Nursery we have been reading the story of the Gigantic Turnip. In this story, an old man and an old woman plant some seeds to grow vegetables. One of the turnips grows to be gigantic so the old man cannot pull it up by himself.



The old man and the old woman "pulled and heaved and tugged and yanked but the turnip would not move." They then call all of their animals to help in the end "There was the old man, the old woman, the big brown cow, two pot belly pigs, three black cats, four speckled hens, five white geese, six yellow canaries and the little hungry mouse. They pulled and heaved and tugged and yanked and Pop! The turnip came out."



We have been using small world characters to re-read the story. If you do not have this book at home you could watch it on you tube to try to retell the story.


#### Dip and Do


These are some ideas of things that you may like to do to support your child's learning at home.

- Can you retell 'The gigantic turnip story?'

or repeated phrases.









New 3-a-day Stories for Amber, Casper and Millie group children: The children have learnt our last 3 a day stories really well. These are our new 3 a day stories for this half term:

1 and another 1 and another 1 make 3. How else can you make 3?
















We have been using our whole bodies to create art. We have had to use our finger muscles to spray the paint and all of our core muscles to paint with large paintbrushes.

Can you write a shopping list?



This website also provides parents with lots of information about how phonics it taught using The Little Wandle phonics scheme. This is the scheme that we use in Reception to help the children to learn to read and write. We are currently teaching the Foundations for Phonics in Nursery. We teach the children the phoneme sound that each letter makes but children are not expected to learn what the letters look like until Reception (some children will recognise the letter that matches to each phoneme). Please use the link below to ensure that you are pronouncing the phonemes correctly if you practise phonics skills at home. So far we have looked at objects that begin with the same phoneme sound as these pictures e.g. for cat we know that cake, crab and camel begin with the same 'c' phoneme.

How to say Phase 5 sounds

Picture card	Pronunciation phrase	Formation phrase
snake	Show your teeth and and let the s hiss out ssssss ssssss	Down the snake from head to tail.
astronaut	Open your mouth wide and make the <b>a</b> sound at the back of your mouth <b>a a a</b>	Around the astronaut's helmet and down into space.
tiger	Open your lips; put the tip of your tongue behind your teeth and press <b>t t t</b>	Down the tiger and across its neck.
	Bring your lips together, push them open and say <b>p p p</b>	Down the penguin's back, up and around its head.
iguana	Pull your lips back and make the <b>i</b> sound at the back of your mouth <b>i i i</b>	Down the iguana and dot the leaf.
net	Open your lips a bit, put your tongue behind your teeth and make the <b>nnnn</b> sound <b>nnnn</b>	Down, up and over the net.
mouse	Put your lips together and make the <b>mmmmm</b> sound <b>mmmmm</b>	Down, up and over the mouse's ears.

Picture card	Pronunciation phrase	Formation phrase
duck	Put your tongue to the top and front of your mouth and make a quick <b>d</b> sound <b>d d d</b>	Round the duck's body, up to its head and down to its feet.
goat	Give me a big smile that shows your teeth; press the middle of your tongue to the top and back of your mouth; push your tongue down and forward to make the <b>g</b> sound <b>g g g</b>	Round the goat's face and curl under its chin.
octopus	Make your mouth into round shape and say <b>o o o</b>	All around the octopus.
cat	Open your mouth into a little smile; make your tongue flat and move it up towards the top of your mouth to say <b>c c c</b>	Curl around the cat.
