<h1>Gold</h1>	<p>Which decade do you wish you had lived through, since WW2? 1950s OR 1960s OR 1970s OR 1980s OR 1990s. Why? Persuade your teacher why your chosen decade was the best! (You should write at least half a page).</p>
<h1>Silver</h1>	<p>We have looked at different bar charts a few weeks ago. Choose a sports team. Represent one aspect of their statistics as a bar chart. For example number of goals scored in games, red/yellow cards given or attendance at games.</p>
<h1>Bronze</h1>	<p>Our Spring Celebration assembly on Wednesday morning will be a chance for children to celebrate spring time and some of our favourite things about this time of year – chicks, daffodils, new life, sunshine and chocolate. If your child would like to make and wear a Spring Bonnet to assembly on Wednesday we would love them to do so. We will also draw Yippy’s raffle prizes and sing some of our spring favourite songs (Spring Chicken and The Chocolate Song)</p> <p>Spring Bonnets can be made of anything you have at home – either decorations stuck to an existing hat or entirely made from scratch; maybe they have a bonnet from a previous year. Can you think about using sustainable materials and recycling?
