Things to know for next week:

- ★ On Monday we will be creating our Toy Museum. Your child needs to bring in a toy this can be their own modern toy, or a toy from your childhood. It would be really nice to get a range of toys from across the last few decades. After school on Monday we would love to invite you into the classrooms to see the children's curations! We look forward to seeing you then.
- ★ On Tuesday, Year 2 will be creating a bug hotel. Please send your child in with a small can/ tub/ container to make their hotels with. The children will need some materials to fill their bug hotels with, so please could they spend some time outdoors gathering some materials to fill their bug hotel with twigs, leaves, moss, grass, pebbles etc. Please bring this in on Monday with their can/ tub/ container.
- ★ Our Spring Celebration assembly on Wednesday morning will be a chance for children to celebrate spring time and some of our favourite things about this time of year chicks, daffodils, new life, sunshine and chocolate. If your child would like to make and wear a Spring Bonnet to assembly on Wednesday we would love them to do so. We will also draw Yippy's raffle prizes and sing some of our spring favourite songs (Spring Chicken and The Chocolate Song)
- ★ Spring Bonnets can be made of anything you have at home either decorations stuck to an existing hat or entirely made from scratch; maybe they have a bonnet from a previous year. Can you think about using sustainable materials and recycling? Enquiry Question of the week

Design a bug hotel - what features will your microhabitat need?

This week we have reviewed what a microhabitat is and how they might be different for a variety of animals/ insects. Microhabitats can provide alternative food and water sources, shelter and climate than larger habitats. Small animals such as insects, mice and frogs often make use of microhabitats when the habitat they are in makes them vulnerable to predators. Depending on the creature, a microhabitat will be different, as what they eat and how they sleep will be different.

The children will be using these ideas to make their bug hotels next week, so please make sure you ask them about their chosen bug for their bug hotel, and what it will need to survive in it.

A summary of next week:
