A summary of next half term:

SPAG: homophones

Writing: The children will begin the term by reading an abridged version of Oliver Twist, they will then write a narrative based on the famous "Please Sir, can I have some more scene". They will then read "Me, My Dad and the end of the Rainbow". Following this the children will write a newspaper report based on this amazing book!

History: The children will learn about life as a rich and poor Victorians, focusing on the lives of children. The children will also learn about the Industrial Revolution and the impact of this.

DT: mechanical structures

Maths: shape, space, measure, angles and translation

Science: Animals (including humans) and reproduction in plants.

Computing: Scratch and exploring algorithms
