Who was Queen Victoria and what impact did she have on the British Empire?

A: Queen Victoria ruled the United Kingdom for 63 years, from when she was 18 years old. She was born in 1819 and became queen in 1837. She died in 1901.

Queen Victoria had a big impact on her country in terms of industry, working conditions, education, family values however her biggest legacy was the development of the British Empire, it became one of the largest empires in the world. British culture and values were imposed on the countries in the British Empire and trade between the countries flourished. Not everyone agreed with the power that Britain had over these countries and within the world.
