Peek at the Week The Three Little Pigs



This week we have been looking out for the Big Bad Wolf as we read the story of the Three Little Pigs. The children have enjoyed creating their own puppets to retell the story as well as sequencing pictures on a story map. We also used different materials to try and build a wall that couldn't be blown down. We have been using our phonics to write speech bubble sentences for what the characters might be saying. On Friday, the children used straw mixed with wet mud to start building a wall by filling in the gaps of a wooden pallet. We will see how successfully that works when it dries out. We wanted to show them that it is possible to use straw as a building material.

In Maths, we have been exploring odd and even numbers. Using blocks the children made pairs. If there was one block left, they knew they had an odd number.

The children had their class photos this week and were very sensible in the Hall. They listened to instructions and gave their best smiley faces!
