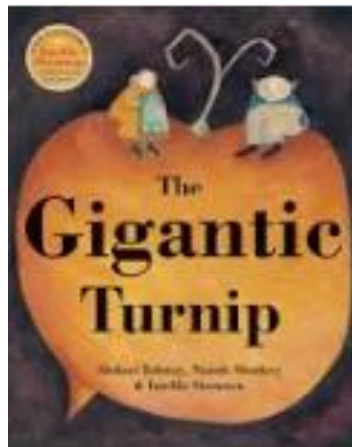


Nursery Peek at the Week

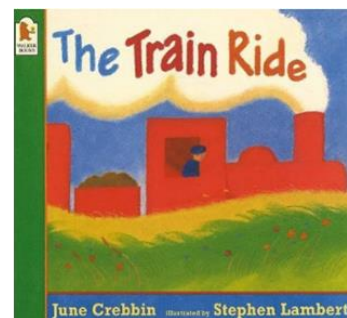
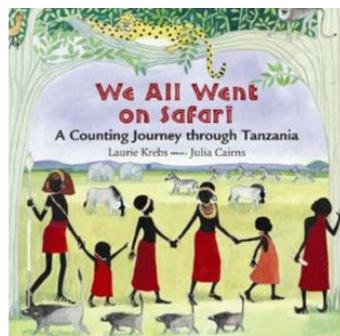
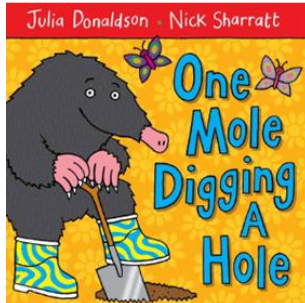
Nursery Fees
