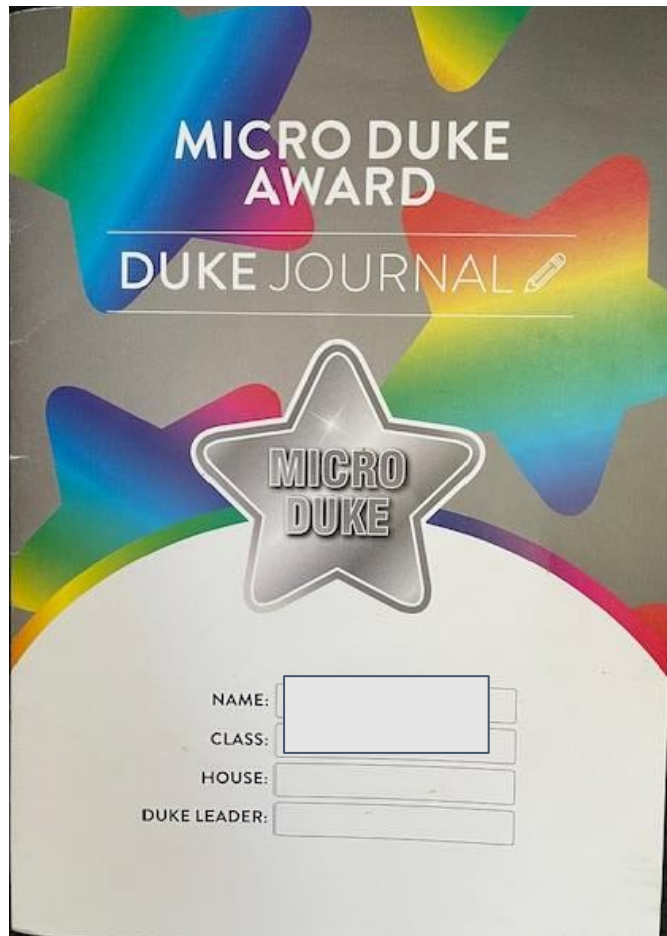


Mystery Reader

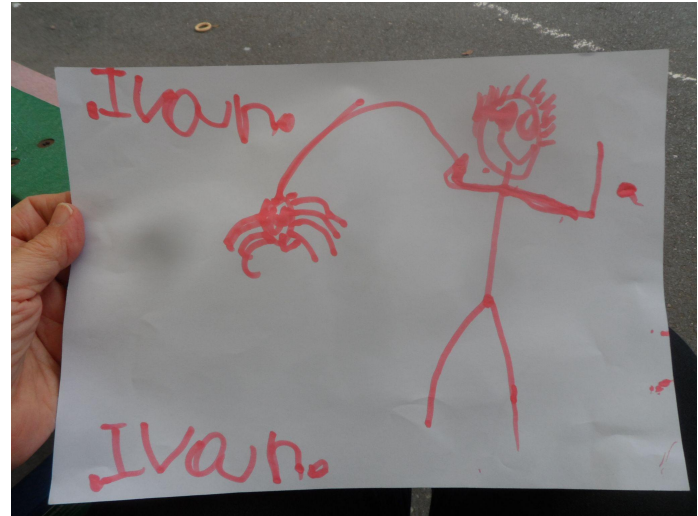

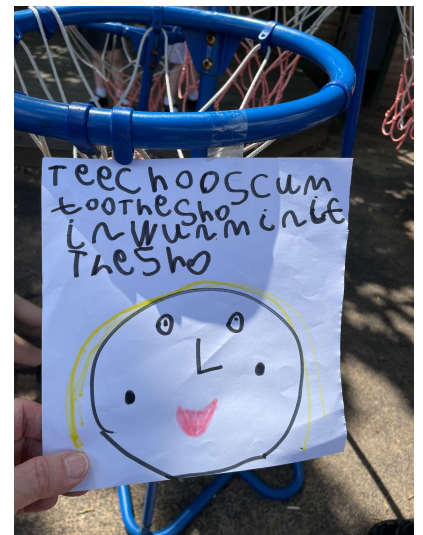
